Wrawby's next 'Vicar'

The legal side will probably take years to sort out!

But, for practical purposes, Wrawby now has a new 'Vicar'. She is the Revd Marie Thorne, who for the last two years has been Curate of Brigg.

At a service in Wrawby Church on 22 November, the Archdeacon of Stow, the Ven Roderick Wells, was due to extend Marie's licence from the Bishop allowing her to work in the area for another three years.

At the same service, the arrangements were to be confirmed by which the three parishes of Brigg, Cadney (with Howsham) and Wrawby are to work together.

The result is that the Revds Geoff Neale (Vicar of Brigg) and Marie Thorne are now sharing responsibility for the three parishes - with Marie having special responsibility for Wrawby.

Marie admits to being excited at the way things have worked out and looks forward to making many new friends in the village. There is an unconfirmed possibility that she will come to live in Wrawby Vicarage. Meanwhile she may be contacted at 5 Winston Way, Brigg DN20 8UA (Tel Brigg 655609).


As usual the service will include plenty of activity in which young children can take part and - again as usual - parents will be involved in the planning and running of the service.

WANTED: A Peg in the Vestry

Canon Ted Greathead looks back over the last ten months at St Mary's

On 22 November I shall come to the end of my time as Parish Minister at Wrawby. I started on 26 January this year, when Basil Templeton returned to South Africa. So I have been trying to keep the show on the road for almost ten months.

In January your future was uncertain and many people were feeling very gloomy. In spite of the gloom, some of you were determined that at least two things that Basil Templeton had started were going to succeed- the monthly Family Service (which was really a revival of something you had done before) and the Pram Service.

Both these are now well established and the number of people attending them is growing steadily. The Pram Service is never less than twenty, and the Family Service hovers around the fifty to sixty mark. Well done! I'm proud of you.

But there are other things too. A small group meets regularly at John Cole 's house and there's just a chance that it will, in time, grow into a lay ministry team.

And then there is the Church of England Junior School, now coming to church at least once a term and bringing a lot of parents along as well. This piece of co-operation was particularly notable at the Harvest Festival; not only did we raise a considerable sum for overseas aid but we enjoyed the fun and

fellowship of the Harvest Hoe Down with the Stubble jumpers (appropriately named!).

Basil Templeton also encouraged the monthly joint Anglican/Methodist Family Service at the Methodist Church and this too has continued and could also be a growing point for joint work in the future. Because of my other duties I have been unable to attend any of these joint services but I hope to be able to join in after Christmas when I shall not be so busy as I have been so far.

Some very good work has been done on the parish magazine - until recently only bought and read by a select few and now supplied free of charge to every house in the parish. The news sheet is most attractively produced and has had a considerable impact on the community at large - already, even though this is only the third issue. So, once again, congratulations to the people who have produced it and the army of volunteers who see to the distribution of it.

A year ago there was doom and gloom; but now you've decided where you are going and everything looks much brighter.

One accidental spin-off from the new partnership with Brigg and Cadney is that there is a real possibility, not yet quite a certainty, that Wrawby Vicarage will not be sold and will continue to be occupied by a Minister for the next three years.

So, haven't you done well? Iin really very proud of you all. I have just one little request: Could I have a peg in the vestry with my name on it, please? It is very important for a retired clergyman to know he has a place to hang his cassock. It makes him feel he's still wanted.







Christmas Cheer

John Cole observes that we can't stay cheerful on the cheap!

"Consumer confidence," we are told, "is what is needed to get this country out of recession." Well, I suppose I know what they mean..

For you and me it probably amounts to this: Do we feel we can afford to go on the usual spending spree this Christmas? Are we sure that we will go on getting a steady income next year?

Now you might expect me, as a clergyman, to complain that all this worry about money just shows how far this nation (you and I) has fallen for the sin of greed. But in fact, the question about our 'consumer confidence' is a remarkably religious one:

Whether or not people choose to spend their money says a lot about how secure people are - or how hopeful. It is a good indicator of whether they think life for them is going to get better or worse.

When people worry about their job or the size of their pension, they are facing a religious issue. They're not asking traditional 'churchy' questions (like "How can I be saved?") but, in their unease about the future, they are implicitly asking, "Can we really be hopeful any more?"

Christians believe God got directly involved in his world at a very similar unstable period in history. The baby born in the manger at Bethlehem didn't seem to have much future. And the story of what happened when the child became a man - and got unjustly put to death on a cross - doesn't seem to offer much hope either.

But then, does it? God getting directly involved, God living in Christ with us in all our hopes and frustrations. What matters is noticing him - or perhaps, more helpfully, letting him find us.. There is something here which provides good reason for some Christmas cheer - but it doesn't come on the cheap. What do you reckon?





Introducing the Revd Marie Thorne

Marie Thorne describes herself as excited at the prospect of being involved with Wrawby. She has heard good news of "shoots beginning to grow" and she looks forward to nurturing these and encouraging people. "The basic plank of my ministry is encouragement," she says.

Marie is a native of Cleethorpes. She was ordained Deacon six years ago after completing three years' training. Before that she was, in her own words, "full-time mother and part-time library assistant."


Marie's husband Keith works for Conoco. Daughter Katherine is now in her third year of teacher training at the College of Ripon and York St John. Her other daughter Rebecca is working for `A' levels at John Leggott College before going next August to the Queen's Medical Centre to train as a nurse.

Marie came to Brigg as Curate two years ago. Before that she was on the staff of St Aidan's Cleethorpes which had been her home parish before ordination.

The call to ministry had been with her since teenage. She remembers meeting a Deaconess when she herself was 17 and thinking "This is what I have always wanted to do". At that stage it all seemed impossible. The key was when non-residential training courses were introduced about ten years ago. No longer did she have to go away to college and leave her family in order to train.

The recent vote about whether or not women should be ordained priest has been a traumatic time. Over the years she had learned to live with the fact that she had to watch while male priests presided at the Holy Communion. In recent months expectations have been raised; and, whatever the outcome of the vote, there's a new situation to learn to live with Even now that we know the





vote is 'Yes', we are told that it will still be two years before any of the existing Deacons are ordained Priest.

Marie was asked about her special interests - what was it that made her different from anyone else? "There's nothing that makes me different," she replied. "That's the whole point. I'm no different to anyone else, so hopefully I can understand how people feel because that's how I feel."

We welcome Marie and her family and wish her every happiness in her ministry with us.

'Open Gardens' suggested for Wrawby

Other villages have done it and enjoyed it. Perhaps now it is Wrawby's turn.

The suggestion has been made that sometime next summer - as a community and fund-raising event - we should host 'WRAWBY OPEN GARDENS', inviting members of the public to look round gardens in our village.

Already one or two people have agreed to open their gardens, but lots more offers are needed to make the event viable.

Different types of garden are needed to make it interesting for visitors - large and small gardens, formal and cottage, dry, damp (even boggy!), shaded, south-facing, west-facing. Don't be shy about volunteering yours!

In January a small committee will be set up to organise the event. However, for the moment the call goes out for all Wrawby's keen gardeners to assist on the day, take charge of a plant stall, grow plants for sale, serve teas and refreshments etc.



WRAWBY's 10.30 services will be at 10.45 am on the Second, Third (Family Service) and Fifth Sundays, with 8.0 am services on the other Sundays. The Family Service at the Methodist Church is not affected.

BRIGG's 9.30 services will move to 9.15 am and the monthly 8.0 am BCP Communion and 9.15 am Family Service will move to the Second Sunday in the month.

Christmas Wishes

As I write these notes at the beginning of November, thoughts of Christmas and its associated good cheer are far from my mind. The last few days have been especially difficult, distressing and full of sadness, and the joys of Christmas seem a long way away.

When you read these words, you may already be seeing Christmas cards drop through your letterbox. I wonder, as you read the words on the cards, what they mean to you. Words like "Seasons Greetings", "Happy Christmas", "May the joys of the season be with you", "Best wishes" appear on most cards. But what exactly are they saying?

The sending and receiving of Christmas cards is a simple way on communicating with one another. The cards tell someone that you are in another person's thoughts (even if only once a year); they are a reminder of friendship, of family, of memories, of holidays.

Receiving cards can bring a lot of joy and comfort, especially to those who live one or who are going through a bad patch. There is a saying that "no man is an island" and that "you are never one". A Christmas card is a tangible sign that this is true.

I wish you all a very happy Christmas and the blessing of a safe and successful New Year.




