

'Wrawby Day'' goes ahead on 8 May




Marie Thorne notes that she will personally miss their optimism and the assurance, which they seemed to generate, that any obstacle can be overcome.


"Our loss", she writes, "is Normanbyby-Spital's gain; but I know that Brian and Christine will maintain their friendship with Wrawby."

Chapels of Rest - Own Hearse and Limousines

Despite high winds, whipping coats and scarves, the Ladies of Wrawby Afternoon Townswomen's Guild battled their way into a cosy atmosphere for their first meeting of the new year. The excitement of Christmas over, it was time to learn something new.

Mr Williams, the Curator of the Baysgarth Museum arrived. He too had done battle with doors, curtains and equipment before settling into the story of Baysgarth House, Barton. As he said at the beginning, "a perfect setting for a Barbara Cartland novel."

The story unfolded.

From the early Roman road to the Viking streets, then to the monks with their fishpond - all this on a piece of land, later to be the site of Baysgarth House.

The saga continued with the entry of the Nelthorpes and the land they owned, including parts of Wrawby and Yorkshire.

After many changes over the years, Baysgarth House became a museum based on local history and numerous artefacts. Its wealth of information also produced an on-going special feature of small exhibitions.

This short description of the workings of the Museum also included the hidden work done by a dedicated staff.

The vote of thanks was given by Mrs Helen Broadhurst. It was unanimously agreed that a trip to the Baysgarth Museum






must be on the forthcoming agenda.

After the great success in 1993, many of us gardeners felt we needed time to recover ourselves (and our gardens) before


opening them again. However, lots of people have been asking for a repeat event - so how about this year?


We need brave volunteers who could be persuaded that their garden would be of interest to others. It can be large or small, flowers or vegetables.


Live music at Friends' Spring Dance

At the beginning of November we buried my uncle Arthur Good, and at the beginning of last month we buried my father John Good: two brothers from one family so soon after one another - shock and devastation to our family spirit and morale.

Love is, as the popular song goes, "a many splendoured thing", whether it is the love of a parent for a child, of a husband or wife for their spouse, of young love, the love of a pet and many other ways in which love manifests itself. Many will be reminded on the fourteenth of this month (St Valentine's Day) of a love they may or may

The legacy of both these brothers, however, is very precious for they loved their family.

It is incredibly difficult to put into words how deep that love was. As I look back over my relationship with my father, it is with the feeling of love very much at the forefront, his patience with mv unpredictability as a child, his encouragement of my work at school and in my career, his support when things appeared to be getting too much and his pride when all went right. But above all it was that he was always there for his family that he loved. Words can never fully express my gratitude for such a loving atmosphere from both my parents.

"Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking. it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails..."




