EASTER HOPE

"It is going to get worse before it gets better" or "the worst is yet to come" have been sayings banded about with regard to the current financial climate and the recession that we find ourselves in at the moment. For many this has brought uncertainty about the future and for some pain and distress at being made redundant and the loss of their job. Redundancy has been described as being like a bereavement, for not only has your job gone, but the camaraderie of colleagues, the security of income has all gone as well, replaced by feelings of anxiety, guilt, and real grief. A sense of helplessness, despair and hopelessness pervades. "What happens now?"

It is said that every cloud has a silver lining, even though it is difficult to see sometimes. There is every chance that eventually this depression will lift and opportunities will once again present themselves. What the current situation has forced us all to do is to take stock and think carefully about the options available to us. It may well be the chance to start completely afresh, perhaps looking for an opening in an entirely different direction. Possibly, it may force us to do something we've always wanted to do but been afraid to try.

In a way following the Easter story is the same. In St John's Gospel Jesus tells his disciples: "you will weep and mourn while the world rejoices. You will grieve, but your grief will turn to joy...Now is your time of grief, but I will see you again and you will rejoice, and no one will take away your joy." Jesus speaks these words to his disciples shortly after the Last Supper and was trying to prepare them for the traumatic events about to take place.

The disciples could not really have imagined what was about to take place; the arrest of Jesus, the baying mob demanding that he be crucified to death, the torture and crucifixion itself, the utter devastation at the realisation that their world and their hopes had all been dashed to pieces. "What happens now?"

In their grief and distress they wandered about aimlessly, they'd buried his body and were about to perform the final act of respect when their world and indeed their lives were transformed by the discovery that Jesus was raised from the dead. The lives of the disciples would never be the same again.

Easter is a time of hope, of new beginnings, of joy, but it is preceded by a time of despair, pain and utter hopelessness. It is the joy that ultimately wins over the despair and so I pray that it will again despite the turmoil we are going through at the moment.
