
support of Wrawby News readers... Hilary writes



PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The A18 between Wrawby and Barnetby Top will be closed for a fortnight from 2nd April for strengthening of the railway bridge east of Wrawby.

It was noted that very short notice had been received from North Lincs Council for this closure, but the Parish Council was advised that originally only one lane at a time was to be closed, to be controlled by traffic lights, but Health and Safety issues now required a full closure.



The official diversion is along Barton Road and through Elsham.

The January police report showed that there were no recorded crimes in Wrawby in that month, although two minor traffic collisions, two suspicious incidents and an alleged criminal damage incident were reported. The police once again ask all residents to remain vigilant.


North Lincs Council completed a survey of traffic speed on Barton Road Wrawby during the period 22nd to 28th January 2010.



Of a total of 19503 vehicles going through the survey (both ways) during the period, there was a total offending rate of over 45mph (40mph limit) of 21.8%, with an average of 609 vehicles per day exceeding 45mph. The figures were 387 @ 45-50mph, 193 @ 50-60mph, 24 @ 60-70mph and 5 at over 70mph. These figures are being looked at by the Road Safety Officer at North Lincs Council who will decide what action is needed.

Morning Prayer at St Mary's continues to go from strength to strength, and it continues to teach me things about God. Since I wrote about it last October, we have had a couple of variations to the normal pattern. For Advent it was led by different members of the group, with me giving some thoughts about the song John the Baptist's dad, Zechariah, sang when John was born, known as the Benedictus. We also had one week where the order of service was decided by the throw of a dice. For Lent, again we decided to rotate the leader but then finish with a short Eucharist.

As the first week of Lent was in half term we were joined by some of the school-age children who were trying to get as close as possible to the table with the bread and wine on. Towards the end of the service, Brandon and Adam helped me with the ritual cleaning (or ablution) of the vessels. When they asked what I was doing, I said I was washing up, to which the reply came, "You don't wash up like that, you need to use soap."

Apart from learning how to wash up properly, I also realised some other things that week. As you can imagine, especially if you read the October article, Friday Morning Prayer can be a very chaotic, noisy and messy service, particularly as all of the children are now mobile! However, when it came to the Eucharist, and the same has happened most weeks, the children tended to return to their parents and quieten down. Now, I'm not suggesting that the Eucharist service has magical sedative properties, but the children did seem to instinctively know that something important was happening, even if they didn't know what.

This made me reflect on how I approach Eucharist services. I usually go to at least four Eucharists each week, and for most I'm busy thinking about what I need to be doing in the service, or sometimes what I need to be doing for the rest of the day, and so I often miss the importance of what is actually happening. Like the children, I may not be able to say exactly what is happening or how, except that Jesus has commanded us to do it, and that he promises to meet us in it and bless us through it. That should be enough to make me sit in my heavenly Father's arms and quieten down.

Another thing that struck me that first week, and each week since, during the distribution of the bread and wine. To do this I have to move around the group trying not to tread on piles of soft bricks, building bricks, pencils, crayons, paper, books and anything else that happens to be on the floor. And it struck me that this is exactly what God does, come to us where we are, even in the middle of our mess, to bless us. We think about this especially at Christmas when we celebrate God coming to earth as a human in the person of Jesus, but it is also just as appropriate for Holy Week and Easter.

At this time we remember Jesus' anger at injustice and blocking people's access to God (on Palm Sunday), his meals with his friends (Maundy Thursday), his anguish at his future (in the Garden of Gethsemane), his excruciating pain and feelings of abandonment (Good Friday) and his new life and the possibility of new beginnings after his resurrection (Easter Day). In short, at Easter too we remember that God is with us in our mess, because he's experienced it through Jesus. And this is true not just in church, but, as we've been looking at in our Lent course on Christian Life and Work, God is with us all day, every day and can be found wherever we are.
