Ever wondered how Google and Yahoo make so much money? Once you are registered, simply click on the charities tab in the top right hand corner and select St Mary's Church Wrawby as your chosen charity from the list of charities. Every search you then make from EveryClick then earns money for the church. You can see how much you have earned on your account and see how much has been raised for the church in total. You can also set Every Click as your homepage if wish – that way you won't miss a single search payment.

To join Give As You Live, go to <u>www.everyclick.com</u> and click on the Find Out More button in the Give As You Live section and download Give As You Live. It is very safe and straightforward and there are clear instructions. Then simply start your shopping **from** the Give As You Live website- again very easy to use.

If you shop online already, it really is money for nothing and the Give As You Live payments mount up very quickly.

Wrawby Neighbourhood Watch

In February 4 members of the Neighbourhood Watch committee attended a meeting in Scunthorpe organised by the Safer Neighbourhoods team. Speakers gave us an update with regard to metal thefts, an interesting item regarding safeguarding your laptop or android phone and information about a charity being launched called Crimestoppers.

Regarding laptops, if your laptop or mobile phone is stolen, you can help the police find it. Software now exists which will allow you to locate your stolen laptop or android mobile. Alternatively it can record what is being viewed on your screen or take a picture on the camera which can help identify the product's location. Some software has a charge, but there are some downloadable programmes which are free. Search the web for "free laptop tracking programs" or use **www.preyproject.com**

Also, if your property is stolen make sure you can describe it to the police by keeping a record of makes, models and unique serial numbers or by registering the details onto **www.immobilise.com** This is a web based property records system, endorsed and searchable by all UK Police Forces and can help ensure stolen property can be identified and help bring offenders to justice.

The charity **Crimestoppers** is an independent charity which respects your anonymity. It is not the police, they won't ask your name, and will never record or trace your call and you will never have to go to court. The police cannot solve crime on their own, they need your help. When someone talks to **Crimestoppers**, they talk to a specially trained person who then passes on your information to the police. A team of 14 people are based in Humberside to deal with your calls 24/7. At no time will your personal details be asked for. 74% of people will not report crime to the police. Information is needed from the public about people who commit crimes and the **Crimestoppers** number to call with any information is **0800 555 111**.

This is **not** a number to call about crimes in progress, you must still **dial 999**. It is to give anonymous information about criminals, crime scenes, drugs etc. which will be passed on to the police and which they may find useful in providing the missing link, enabling someone to be charged with a crime.

Humberside **Crimestoppers** operates 24/7 and across the UK every 9 days one person is charged with murder, thanks to calls to **Crimestoppers** and £200,000,000 of drugs have been taken off the streets, so please use this number if you have any helpful information.

Wrawby 'Make and Sale'

Notes from 6th March Parish Council Meeting

Police Matters

For January 2012, the police recorded only one crime in Wrawby (affray in a private dwelling) together with 7 other minor matters (traffic incidents etc.) Once again, these figures are very encouraging, but the need to stay vigilant remains. Please report anything suspicious, however minor it may seem. The non-emergency number is 101, and ask for Brigg Police Station.

Voluntary Car Service/Mini Bus Service

These schemes, financially supported by Wrawby Parish Council, are run by Humber and Wolds Rural Community Council. The Voluntary Car Service (VCS) is available to anyone who requires transport to doctors, hospitals, opticians, shops etc. and who either does not have access to public or private transport, or for health reasons cannot use public transport. Passengers pay voluntary drivers a mileage rate of 43p per mile - no payment is made to HWRCC. During the past year, over 8000 passenger journeys were arranged for N. Lincs residents. All drivers are CRB checked. 48 hour notice is required and the number is 01724 732560 (Robin Bradshaw). Anyone wishing to join the volunteer drivers pool must have a valid driving licence and own their own car - the service always requires more drivers. Please use the contact details above if you think you could help.

The Mini-bus service provides wheelchair accessible mini-buses with trained volunteer drivers for use by community groups and individuals with severe mobility problems. HWRCC currently runs and operates 2 such vehicles with 21 community groups registered with it. Once again, the contact details are: telephone 01724 732560 (Robin Bradshaw).

Village Hall

The Village Hall has recently been re-decorated and new carpeting has been laid in the vestibule. New tables, costing nearly £500, are on order and will shortly be delivered. The Hall is an amenity second to none and should anyone wish to organise a function, please contact Sue Day on 653699 for details.

The Parish Council, through the Village Hall Committee, continues to invest heavily in the Hall facilities - it is an excellent local facility with good car parking - please use it.

It is particularly disappointing, in view of the above, to report that odd incidents of vandalism, usually involving footballs being kicked against the walls and doors, are once again being seen. As residents may recall, the Hall and car park were previously targeted by vandals, but after speaking with the police, certain measures were taken (car park barrier, perimeter concrete ridge etc) involving council (and therefore residents) expenditure. Can all residents please ensure that present acts of vandalism are eradicated completely to ensure that the Village Hall remains a valuable local facility.
