Officials

All the officials for Wrawby Parish Council agreed to serve in office for the period April 1st 2015 to March 31st 2016.

Notice Board

Further to recent comments, the Notice Board at the Village Hall has once again been damaged by vandals. In view of the constant problem of vandalism being seen, it was resolved to re-site the Board in the centre of the village (exact site to be finalised). It is hoped that this re-siting will have the twin benefits of reducing vandalism and making the information in the Board more accessible to residents.

Village Hall Lighting

Another victim of vandalism has been the photocell sensor for the exterior "street" light sited on the outside of the Village Hall. As residents are aware from previous comments, this has also been vandalised on a number of occasions, resulting in the area around the Hall being plunged into darkness. As also previously mentioned, Council has been In discussion with an electrical contractor to look into re-siting the photocell. This has now been done but the cost of previous vandalism and this latest re-siting is over £500.

Police Re-organsiation

Councillors heard from a North Lincs Councillor present at the meeting, it is felt that, despite recent adverse comments, the 'new' police arrangements in the Brigg area will actually benefit local residents as it is hoped that the increased use of modern technology will reduce the amount of time officers spend on paperwork, thereby freeing them for increased patrols. Brigg Police Station will remain open and a number of detectives will be based there.


