

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The **Police Report** shows Crime levels in Wrawby for April and May were low with only 2 Criminal Damage and 3 Theft crimes reported. The Neighbourhood Police Team is however becoming increasingly concerned at the growing incidence of poaching and lamping. Residents are asked to report anything they consider suspicious or unusual in this respect.

The **Road Safety Partnership** has produced a "Twenty is Plenty" card which can be placed in the window of any resident in a potentially dangerous traffic area, and where the existing 30 mph limit may be inappropriate. Local accident figures are showing an encouragingly downward trend and the Partnership is keen to see this continuing. On light evenings and warmer days, there are more children and pedestrians out and about, therefore travelling more than 20mph in these circumstances is inappropriate. The Clerk has a specimen card and further cards can be obtained from Roy Hindmarsh of the Road Safety Partnership, telephone 01724 297478.

Residents will be aware of the substantial amount of effort and money which has gone into making **Wrawby Village Hall** "second to none" -(new floor, new kitchen, new heating system etc.) Shortly, further improvements will be made, including the provision of car park lighting. Once again, the Parish Council wish to stress that this is a village facility, available for use by all. For further information please contact Sue Day.

A change is as good as a rest

Holidays are taken for many reasons but ultimately it probably comes down to doing something different from what we do in our normal day to day life. A change of scenery, a change of pace, a change of country and language, perhaps just different temperatures experienced; all can contribute to what helps us relax on our breaks away from home.

For many a holiday gives us a chance to experience something new. Sometimes that's easier to do when we're not in our familiar environment and amongst people we know. Father Owain spoke in last month's article about trying different churches and experiencing the diversity out there. This is something I try to do when I'm away from home. During my holiday in June I spent a long weekend in Scarborough and on the Sunday night went to the Parish Church (up near the castle overlooking the South Bay) for Evening Praise. To say it wasn't what I expected is very much an understatement.... There was nothing traditional about this service!

The church had given it's young teenagers the chance to lead an act of worship of their own construction and design – so it was out with the organ, the hymn books, the prayer books and in with the keyboards, drums, guitars, laptops and projectors. The laptops were used to present a cartoon of a conveyor belt showing humans going through the life cycle - being born, growing up, meeting partners, having children, growing old and finally dropping of f the conveyor belt - shown to introduce their theme "There must be more than this".

Music was loud but with strong rhythm and beat and although I didn't know the songs they were easy to join in with; prayers were acted with dramatic interpretations; stories were told with scripture passages. It was a revelation, filled with enthusiasm, deeply spiritual and very thought provoking. If I'd known before I went that the service would have been like that then probably I wouldn't have gone, because I'm an old fuddy duddy. How glad I was that I didn't know, and so able to experience the wonder.

Sometimes all we need to do is to create the opportunity like that church did and discover the hidden talents waiting out there. Like a holiday a change is as good as a rest. Nigel
