PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Information from Wrawby Parish Council Meeting 2nd July 2013

Litter Picking

The Council heard that the village litter picking event in June went very well with 17 people assisting. Another session is set for the middle of July and will have taken place by the time this magazine is published. Councillors once again expressed their appreciation at these efforts.

Green Waste Bins

Residents will probably have seen on TV recently that some neighbouring councils have imposed an extra charge if householders want their garden waste bins emptying. Wrawby Parish Council has been assured that at present, N Lincs Council has no plans to introduce such a charge.

Road and footpath re-surfacing

Council has heard that N Lincs Council, whilst continuing with its pothole repair programme, has now embarked on an exhaustive programme to repair/refurbish many roads and footways in the area, including some in Wrawby. Inevitably there will be some traffic delays whilst this work is undertaken, but hopefully, these will be kept to a minimum.

N. Lincs Council - customer service

Wrawby Parish Council has been advised that N Lincs Council is looking at systems whereby callers to N Lincs Council, on whatever subject, are dealt with promptly and are not kept waiting or transferred to voicemail to be called back etc. Clearly with the very high volume of calls (nearly one and a half million in 2012), this is a complex and major project. The self-reporting portal, previously mentioned, is progressing well and this will assist in the day-to-day reporting of issues – it will shortly be publicised to all residents.

Wrawby Playing Field - Play Area

As has been described previously, the equipment at the play area has been upgraded and Council is pleased to report that its grant application for the re-surfacing costs has been approved and that the work on this will commence shortly. When all the work is completed, some £12,000 will have been spent on the whole play area project.

Wrawby Under Fives - Great News

Challenged with finding a massive £200,00 to build a new permanent Under Fives building, the committee have been fundraising for some time now. North Lincolnshire Council have, however, now pledged £100,000 towards the build when the Under Fives raise the rest.

Nick Schimmel (Chairman Wrawby Under Fives Committee) says 'The committee and staff agree that in order to secure the long term sustainable future of the facility the replacement of the existing temporary build with another temporary building



is no longer a viable option. I am extremely grateful to the council for their support and also to the school, Mrs Potterton and the Governors at Wrawby St Marys for their support with regards to our change in approach. We now have face the real challenge of finding approximately the remaining £100,000 to plug the funding gap. A larger brick building will offer much greater opportunities to the children of Wrawby and the surrounding villages, as well as the wider community.' Additional info:

Draft plans for the new building have been drawn up and the management committee are exploring a variety of funding opportunities.

The committee are extremely keen to hear from individuals, businesses or organisations who feel that they may be help or assist with fund raising or sponsorship to support the delivery of a new build. My wife got a puppy for her birthday, Meg is a cock-a-dor (Cocker Spaniel crossed with a Labrador) and she is tiny; no bigger, at the moment, than a small loaf of bread. We were a little bit uncertain about Holly would accept Meg. Holly being my nine year old German Shepherd.

What I am finding most fascinating as I watch them is the way Meg seems to want to do one thing, whereas Holly seems to have other ideas. For example, Meg will wander across the garden towards the pigs, and Holly keeps trying to nudge her in the other direction. Meg will try to climb onto a chair, Holly will nudge her away. I'm no expert, but it looks to me as if Holly is trying to protect Meg..."Don't go near the pigs, they're much bigger than you and they might accidently hurt you; and don't climb, if you fall you'll hurt yourself"

This is something I can empathise with. My eldest daughter recently turned eighteen... as I write this, she's abroad on holiday with her friends; she's moving away to university in September. Like Holly with Meg, I just want to keep nudging Rebecca away from the dangers. Yet in reality, we all know we have to let them get on with it, and be there for them if things go wrong. This is the age old process as one generation learns to let go as the next finds its way in life.

Our Christian faith teaches us that God has given us free will. The capacity to make choices and decisions for ourselves. God doesn't interfere, He lets go and allows us to grow, flourish and become fully human. He is there to guide and strengthen us when we make space in our lives to listen to Him. The down side is that we tend to blame God when things go wrong. Yet He cannot interfere, because to interfere would be to take away that thing which makes us unique, formed in His likeness - our free will. To either prevent us from doing things, or force us into doing things would be to make us less than fully human.

The instinct to want to protect one another is evident throughout the created order. Yet our free will is a gift – and like all gifts, it should be used appropriately – for the glory of God, and the good of all people. Others can help, guide and support us, but only we, as individuals, can choose how we use this gift.

May God bless you, and all those you love. And may our freedom bring pleasure and joy to God and to all people.
