There will be a variety of crafts, games and activities to have a go at. We will have homing pigeons to handle and a blacksmith to watch at work as well as a display of vintage vehicles and bikes. During the afternoon there will be entertainment from a folk singer, a fiddle group, dancers and hopefully a drill display. MP Andrew Percy will make a speech at 2.45pm. We are also hoping to have a replica trench to view so that the children can get a feel for the conditions the soldiers had to survive in.





Full instructions on its use and how to contact the Ambulance Service for further advise will be printed on the machine. Also training sessions are to be set up – further information in due course.

I was working at Jim's computer a few weeks ago when an email came in saying "Dear Kathryn, your Tile is ready for shipping...can you confirm your delivery address?"

I knew I certainly hadn't ordered a "tile" - why would I order a single tile rather than a couple of boxes? - so I was puzzled by this. I was even more puzzled when I asked Jim about it. He told me it was a product that he had bought in March 2013 as part of a 'crowd funded' business. The "tile" was a little plastic square with some electronics in it that will allow him to locate the item he attached it to using an App on his mobile phone. Excellent if you are in the habit of misplacing /losing/having things stolen. I asked him to explain what "crowd-funding" was, and confess I'm not really a lot wiser, even after a lengthy explanation.

All this made me wonder about two things - firstly, how technology is advancing at a rate of knots (and leaving me way behind in the dark ages - I still struggle to use my mobile to text coherently) and secondly, how our language is changing.

My Grandad was a bricklayer and I remember when I was quite small going out with him when he was doing some work and watching him tiling - putting *tiles* on someone's kitchen wall. The last time I had anything to do with an App, I got a job as a result of my application, and as for crowd funding- Eh????

I am certain that there will be many folk reading this article shaking their heads in despair at my inability to move with the times. I am also certain that there will be more than a handful of folk agreeing with me, and recognising the same lack of understanding in themselves that I've mentioned. Times change and language and words change.

But some words are timeless and their meaning hasn't changed: Love. Peace. Faith. God. To the best of my knowledge these words still mean the same today as they did 200 years ago, 2000 years ago. God is unchanging. His love for us is unchanging. The peace we receive from God is still " beyond all understanding". And faith is still as personal now as 2000 years ago. In my teens I had a badge that said "Jesus Christ, the same yesterday, today and forever". I think there is something very secure and timeless in that statement.


