Parish Council Meeting - 5th November

1. Council received initial notice that roundabouts are to be installed at the Barnetby Top junction and also on the A18 at the entrance to Humberside Airport. As stated previously, there are also plans to install a roundabout at the entrance to Tata works on Brigg Road Scunthorpe.
 2. Council has received initial notice of a proposal to erect a wind farm on Appleby Carrs. It has been noted that the proposed turbines are of such height that they may be visible from certain areas of Wrawby. Appleby Parish Council is closely monitoring the situation, but it is emphasised that there has as yet not been a planning application submitted so further information will be to hand in due course. A small number of raised flower beds (probably three) will shortly be erected in the village and plants have been purchased to be planted in these in due course.

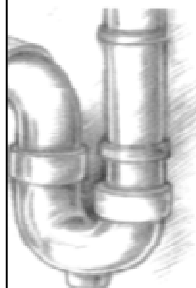

Living History Day 2014

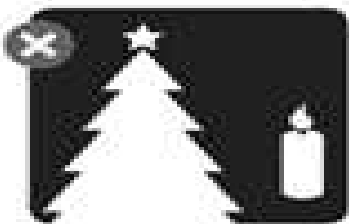

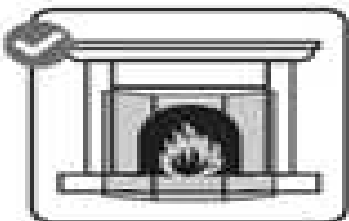
Never place candles where they can catch light to your Christmas tree or other materials.

The 11.00am service in St Mary's Church on Sunday 1st December will be a Methodist Eucharist Service led by a Methodist Minister using the Methodist service book.

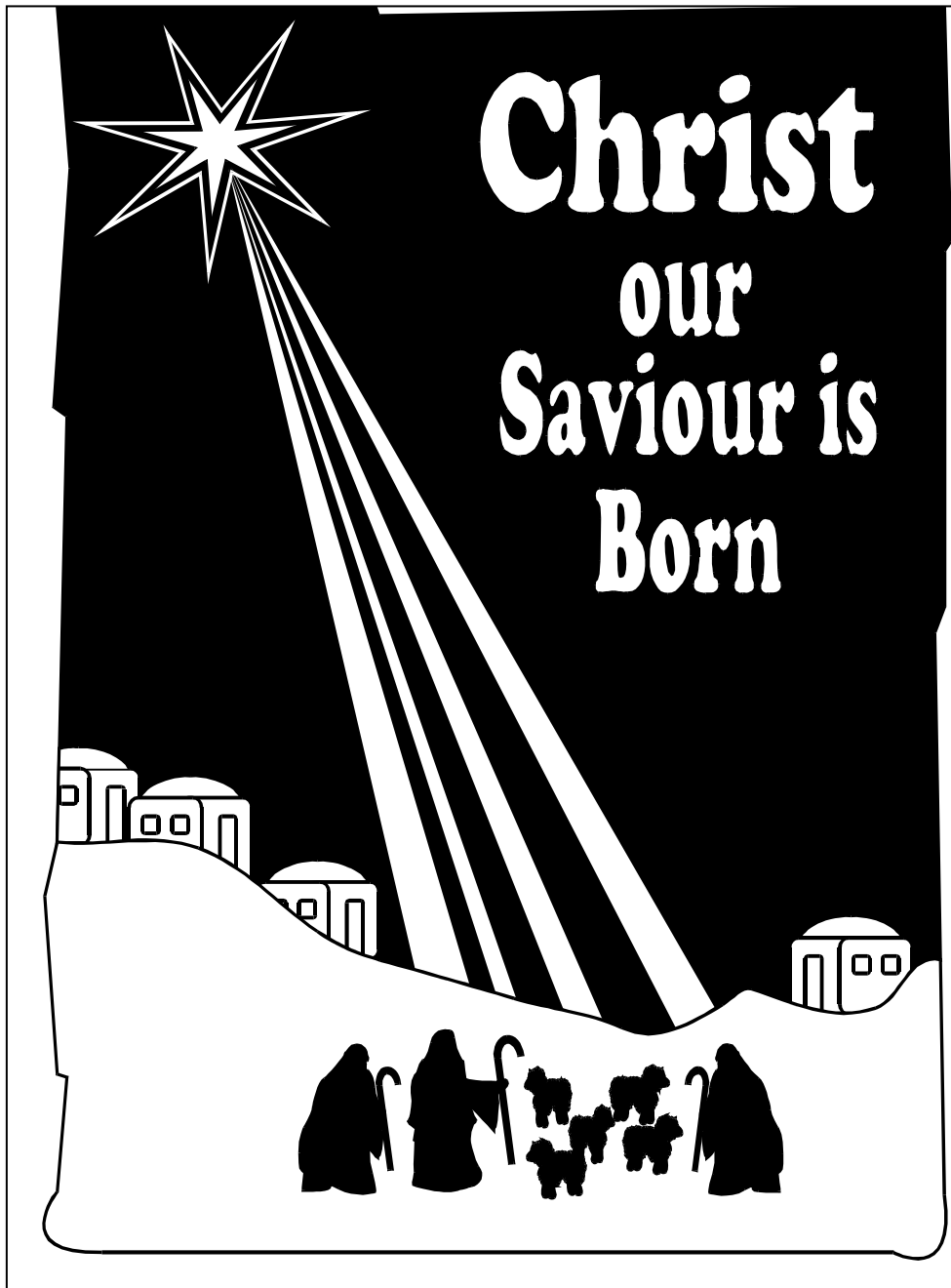

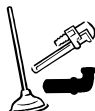

“The light shines in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it.” (John 1:5)

I’m extremely privileged to spend a great deal of time in the three primary schools in our group of parishes. One of the most frequent questions the children ask me is what does my clerical or dog collar represent? It’s also a question adults often ask me. First and foremost, the clerical collar identifies Bishops, Priests and Deacons to the laity (anyone who is not a Clerk in Holy Orders). So wearing a clerical collar makes me identifiable to the c.a.10,000 souls in my care. People see the collar and know I’m their priest – and this creates many wonderful opportunities for impromptu conversations and requests, ranging from on the spot confessions, to blessing crosses and St Christopher’s, to discussions about issues in people’s lives, and many other things. So practically, the clerical collar says to people, “Here is your priest”.

But it also has a symbolic meaning. Meaning which is located in the verse cited above, light shining in the darkness. Deacons, priests and many bishops dress in all black except for the white collar. This signifies the light of Christ breaking through into the darkness of life. It symbolises the resurrection of Christ overcoming death and suffering that first Easter morning, which was only made possible by the incarnation (God taking on human flesh that first Christmas). God entered into the world in human form to share in our suffering and showing us the way home to heaven. Christmas and Easter are mutually dependent. In both cases, light over comes darkness. So the clerical collar is representative, it is symbolic of this fact. “The light shines in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it.”

No matter what life brings, how dark and painful it may get, we always have hope. There is always light. God knows how dark and painful it can be. He became one of us, sharing our lives, only to be rejected by the very people He came to save. Yet, He overcame this through His love, rising from the grave. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness could not overcome it.

We cannot properly think of Christmas without thinking also about Easter. Neither can we celebrate the joy of Christmas without thinking about the suffering of the cross. And as many of us enjoy the fun, peace, love and joy of this season, we hold in our hearts those for whom it will be a time of great suffering, pain and anguish. We pray that the light of Christ will overcome their darkness and ask that God Who became human will strengthen us, that we become divine.

May the light of Christ shine in your hearts, and may God bless you now and always.
