

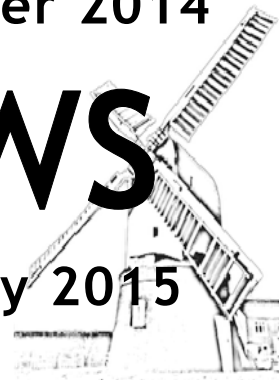

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Playground

Residents will have noted that substantial further improvements/extensions have now been completed at the Playground. The Parish Council congratulates Angela Hunt and all the team on completing what is now an excellent Wrawby amenity.

Dog Fouling

Complaints are still being heard by councillors about the irresponsible dog owners who do not "clean up" after their pets. Although not as bad as previously, it is particularly disappointing that money spent by the Council (which is really YOUR money) on improvements to the village together with efforts put in by many residents – e.g. the playing area above – is still being spoilt by this minority of pet owners. The problem is particularly acute on the Playing Field and is extremely dangerous to users. Let us ensure that all dog owners "clean up".

Footpaths

Council has heard from North Lincs. Council that damaged footpaths on a number of Wrawby locations will shortly be repaired.

Roadworks

As previously reported, the installation of the roundabout at Lakeside, Scunthorpe is nearing completion and all equipment is scheduled to be off site by early December. Sadly the Melton Ross bridge works remain ongoing and there is no date for completion.

Nominated Neighbour Scheme

The 'Nominated Neighbour' scheme started a six-month trial on 3rd November.

The scheme is aimed at vulnerable people, who are provided with a pack and door card to hold up if they are approached at their home by someone they don't know. The card states they do not answer the door to strangers and suggests an address (the nominated neighbour) where the caller should contact or visit to discuss their reasons for visiting the property. In the pack will be a booklet explaining how the scheme works, the role of the Nominated Neighbour and a form to complete, stating they are one.

In March 2015, Kristie Pattinson-Lea from Wrawby is one of 18 students, from Wyke College, to be travelling to South Africa in order to carry out important volunteer work.

“Part of our trip will be based in the township of Olivenhoutbosch, where we will be constructing shacks and assisting in a crèche. The second part of our trip will be in the nearby town of Midrand. There, we will undertake domestic and childcare duties in an orphanage for children aged 0-7 years. Part of our work, in both locations, will be to take the Children on excursion.

We embark on our trip with two key aims. The first is to make a difference by working alongside the established charity, Botshabelo (<http://www.botshabelo.co.za>), which transforms children’s lives. Our work with this passionate, multifaceted charity will have us serving alongside many international and South Africa volunteers, to care and educate children who have been abandoned or removed from their family.

The second aim of our trip is a more personal journey of self development. We will witness, first hand, the situation that many children face in some areas of South Africa, which will be emotionally challenging. Our experience will have a deep and lasting impact on us and will, undoubtedly benefit us socially and change our lives in many ways.

Each volunteer must raise £1900.00 in order to take part in this trip. The accommodation is basic and entirely self-catering, and so, after air flights, a large proportion of this money will go towards purchasing essential project materials, such as building supplies, craft equipment and supplies for the babies home.

Dear reader,

No doubt as you are sitting looking through this month's magazine, you have already started buying your Christmas presents, planning meals, writing cards, posting parcels and various other jobs and traditions that fit with this season. I have shared with you in the past my love of Christmas. I love so many of the traditions that surround this time of year, and I was thinking about some of these traditions when I was pondering about what to write for this article. Different families have different traditions, often passing them down from one generation to another. One of our family "traditions" when we were younger was that we were not allowed to eat any of our Christmas chocolates or sweets until we'd eaten our Christmas lunch.

As a child I thought this was a bit mean, and I remember us being really taken aback, when one Christmas morning my Dad encouraged my Mum to open the box of chocolates that he'd bought her. Of course, we instantly smelled a rat – and when Mum opened the box, he'd bought her a new watch, and replaced one of the layers of chocolates with the watch box. I remember Mum being really thrilled – I don't remember being so impressed myself, because we were then told we still had to wait until after lunch for a chocolate!

Jim and I carried on this tradition of not eating sweets etc, with our own three, and I remember them opening a box of mince pies that a very kind friend had wrapped up for them, one Christmas morning. As per, I whipped it from under their noses, along with the other sweets and scrummy things, and popped it in a cupboard. Somewhere several weeks after Christmas, I opened a tin of custard one tea time and got said box of mince pies out, only to find the kind friend had actually knitted each of my children a lovely pair of mittens, and used the mince pie box to make wrapping them easier! You see, I wasn't expecting to find 3 pairs of children mittens in a mince pie box – and it strikes me that Christmas is a bit like that – sometimes it's not quite what you're expecting.

I don't imagine the Wise Men were expecting to find the Messiah in a cow shed, with a young woman who had travelled a long way from her home town. I don't suppose the Shepherds were expecting a heavenly choir on the hillside that first Christmas eve, telling them to head to Bethlehem to see the Son of God lying in a manger. So much of the Christmas story is about the unexpected. Who would expect God to come and live amongst ordinary folk, experience their concerns and hardships and rub shoulders with some of the most unlovable characters?

This "unexpectedness" is as real today as it ever was, and many people find themselves unexpectedly meeting Jesus, and finding their lives unexpectedly changing for the better. Whatever you are doing this Christmas time, dear reader, I wish you happiness, and watch out for God meeting you in a way you least expect!
