Over 90 children received Christingles and £250 was raised to support the work of the Children's Society.

On the first Saturday of each month a growing number of people are enjoying coffee, cake and conversation when the church opens between 10.00 and 12.00. Members of the Methodist community are organising these popular coffee mornings.

And.... if you go down to the Church on the first Wednesday of the month, you could be in for a big surprise as the Teddy Bear Club will be meeting there; pre-school children who take their teddies and a responsible adult for an hour or so to hear stories, sing songs and enjoy the refreshments.



On each Wednesday during Lent there'll be a communion service, followed by a time for quiet reflection starting at 9.00 a.m., and there's a regular pattern of Sunday services each month, details of which are printed on the back page of this magazine....

On 21st June, midsummer's day, there are plans to hold a Family History day. More details over the coming months.

#### Flood Prevention


Funding has been obtained for the drainage/contracting work around the Village Hall which is intended to prevent future flooding problems. The work started on 9th January.

#### Father Owain Mitchell writes:


"Life moves pretty fast. If you don't stop once in a while and take a look around, you might miss it." [Ferris Bueller's Day Off, written by John Hughes]

How true this is. As I write this article, I've just finished entering another set of date in my diary for the coming year, this time, for the Bible Study Group which meets at the Vicarage on Monday's (Details available on page 5 - all are welcome to join us). It often seems to be the case that our time goes all too quickly. Days seem to merge into weeks, weeks into months and months into years, with our diaries filling up so quickly. It doesn't seem more than a few days ago that we were preparing for our joyful Christmas celebrations. Now we are preparing for Easter. The thoughts of our summer holidays are growing with anticipation as we count down the weeks, and then we're back to preparing for Christmas. Where does the time go?

Time is a precious resource. We don't know where it goes, but it does seem to fly by. We try to make more time for ourselves by buying 'labour saving' devices – automatic washing machines, dishwashers, self-cleaning ovens, petrol or electric mowers, computers and so forth, only to find that we still have no time. How *did* our grandparents manage in a low-tech or even no-tech society? How often do we hear those who have retired comment that they don't know how they found the time to go to work, because in their retirement they are so busy? And in our busy, rushed lives, so many things and commitments place demands on our time that all to often we can loose sight of what is important – family and friends, fun and laughter, relaxation and renewal, even ourselves and our own needs.

During the coming season of Lent, perhaps we ought to get into the habit of making some space each week for ourselves. Half an hour or so just too simply sit and be who we are, and perhaps sit and be with God. At St. Mary's, each Wednesday morning at 9.00, beginning on Ash Wednesday (6<sup>th</sup> February), there will be a Eucharist, followed by a time of quiet. If you are free and would like to, do come along and enter into a time of peace and quiet, a time of refreshment. Enter into the silence, think (or don't, if you prefer to clear your mind) and seek that peace that comes only form sitting at the feet of God, being in his presence in quiet adoration.

"Life moves pretty fast. If you don't stop once in a while and take a look around, you might miss it." Make time to look around you and enjoy what you see. And in that space, may you once again re-discover the important things that we often loose sight of in the hustle and bustle of our daily lives.
