## GAZA APPEAL

After an 18 month blockade of Gaza and three weeks of heavy shelling the humanitarian crisis in Gaza is now completely overwhelming.

### Donate online to the DEC's Gaza Crisis now

Thousands of people are struggling to survive with many having lost their homes and most down to their last supplies of food and only limited amounts of fresh drinking water.

- **Just £25 can buy warm blankets for 8 children**
- **Just £50 can provide a Food parcel for a family for one month**

Electricity - supplies to Gaza are erratic at best with 75% of the area cut off completely. There is a significant public health risk arising out of the almost collapse of Gaza's water and sewage system, the running of which is dependent on electricity.

Water - Around 500,000 people are without running water with 37% of Gaza's water wells not working effectively and fuel reserves depleted due to restrictions on access and damage to pipes.

At least 412 Children have been killed and 1,855 injured  
60% of the population is living in poverty  
1.1 million people are dependent upon aid to survive.

Health - The capacity of the health system has been significantly reduced due to the damage of at least 21 clinics. Ten primary health care clinics are functioning as emergency clinics and hospitals and intensive care units continue to treat the mass casualties.

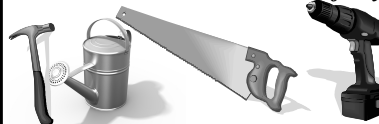

# SMOKE ALARM STILL SAVING LIVES 40 YEARS ON



The smoke alarm is marking its 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of saving lives this year. In 1969 the first battery-operated home smoke alarm was patented by two Americans - Randolph Smith and Kenneth House.

The advent of the smoke alarm has been one of the most important technological events in recent years. By giving people those precious minutes to escape from fire, the working smoke alarm has saved countless lives over the years. Nick Tharratt from Humberside Fire and Rescue Service says,

*“Owning smoke alarms is not enough - test yours weekly to ensure it remains your potential lifeline for future years to come.”*

Recently there has been a rise in the number of cooking related fires especially around tea time. Approximately 70% of fires in the home are cooking related. It is easy to get distracted when cooking especially if the phone rings.

Here are some handy tips to help you prevent a fire in your home:

- If the door bell goes take your cooking off the hob.
- Your grill can kill – keep it clean to prevent any excess food catching fire.
- use a deep fat fryer instead of a chip pan, which can overheat
- Create your own fire escape plan
- Pull your finger out! Make sure you have a full working smoke alarm and test it weekly.

Humberside Fire and Rescue Service are able to visit homes and carry out free Home Fire Safety Checks, smoke alarm fittings and offer any other information to help keep you safe from fire.

## Parish Council News

The following items were discussed at the December and January meetings:

### December

(a) Residents will have noted the revised entrance/exit to Vicarage Motors garage. In response to concerns raised by some parishioners, the Parish Council contacted North Lincs Council Highways Division who advised that the issue is flood related. In periods of heavy rain, water ran off the A18 and inundated the garage in contravention of the Highways Act 1980. It was further stated that in the view of the various departments at the Council (Traffic, Road Safety etc) the relocation of the access is acceptable and that it poses no additional risk over the original location.

(b) There have been reports that fly tipping of rubbish is taking place on the Village Hall car park. The Parish Council and the Village Hall Committee wish to remind everyone that the Village Hall is a village amenity - its upkeep is paid for effectively by Wrawby council-tax payers through the Parish Council. It is requested that if anyone has knowledge of such incidents, then please advise a local councillor, the police or North Lincs Council with as much information as possible so that action can be taken.

### January

1. The police reported that December 2008 had been a relatively quiet month for Wrawby (a theft from a motor vehicle on Wold Court being the only crime reported) but vigilance continued to be required and every suspicious matter, however small, was to be reported to the police.

2. Humber Fire and Rescue have supplied the Clerk with "Home & Driving Safety" leaflets for winter conditions. If any parishioner requires any of these leaflets, please telephone the Clerk, Graham Foster on 651250.

3. North Lincolnshire Rural Local Action Group has secured substantial funding to support local projects, minimum £1000. Types of projects might include:

- (a) developing/enhancing existing services
- (b) village renewal (e.g. community buildings)
- (c) conservation and upgrading rural heritage
- (d) marketing/promotional activities

A local "surgery" is being held at Elsham Village Hall on Monday 9 February 2009 (3pm to 7pm) to identify if a particular project is eligible. 4. A number of parishioners have requested that Royal Mail replace the bricked up Post box on the old Central Stores with a new box in the "centre" of the village. The Parish Council have contacted Royal Mail and their response is awaited.

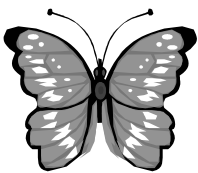

As I write, Barack Obama, his wife and 2 daughters are on board a train, heading for Washington. In a day or two, he will be inaugurated as the President of the United States. 40 years ago, this would have been unthinkable – a black man voting was a rarity – a black man becoming President would have been unimaginable. Barriers are being broken down. (Before I go any further, I feel I should make it perfectly clear, that any barriers I refer to in this article are not of the health and safety sort.) My Granddad, who has been mentioned before in my writings, was born in 1894. I remember him telling me the week after Buzz Aldrin and Neil Armstrong landed on the moon, that if anyone had told him when he was a young lad that he'd see a man walk on the moon, he would have thought they were barmy! Technology boundaries were being moved and barriers that told us such things were impossible had been broken down.

One of my favourite hymns has the line "may we no more defend barriers he died to end". Barriers are being broken. We have seen it in recent years in Northern Ireland, between the Catholics and Protestants. We see it, in volunteers to go to work with agencies like Medecins sans frontieres, and we see it in the election of the 1<sup>st</sup> black President. I often wonder when God created man if He had any idea of the barriers we would find to put up. We all have our own barriers. I have a class of year 11 pupils at school that I am trying to convince they CAN do maths if they think positively (and remember to square root the answer when doing Pythagoras), but some of them have barriers that stop them believing in themselves, or so it seems to me. I have a few barriers of my own – I

won't bore you with them now, - and I'm sure you perhaps have a few too. We put up barriers when we don't want to hear or consider the other persons point of view, or when we don't like our neighbours stand on political issues, or we don't want to get to know the stranger in our midst because they don't look like our sort of person. We also put up barriers when we think things are impossible, and cannot believe that they could ever happen.

Many people put up barriers when God is mentioned. But what I find truly amazing is how God never puts up barriers. Reading through the Gospels, we are reminded time and time again of how Jesus set about breaking down barriers; sitting down to eat with tax collectors, speaking with women, touching the "unclean". I do believe that Jesus is ready to welcome everyone. He doesn't put up barriers that stop people getting close to Him. He doesn't look at creed, colour or worry about political view. Jesus looks into our hearts and loves us despite what He often sees there! And it also strikes me that when mankind puts up barriers that are unfair and unjust towards certain sectors of society, God puts in place events that will knock these barriers down. And so very often He uses the most unexpected and humble people.

I wonder if Rosa Parkes had any idea of the barriers that she was beginning to tear down when she said she was too weary to give up her seat on a bus in Montgomery in 1955? And would she have believed it if someone had told her that in 2009 Barack Obama would become the President? Or would she have just thought they were barmy?!
