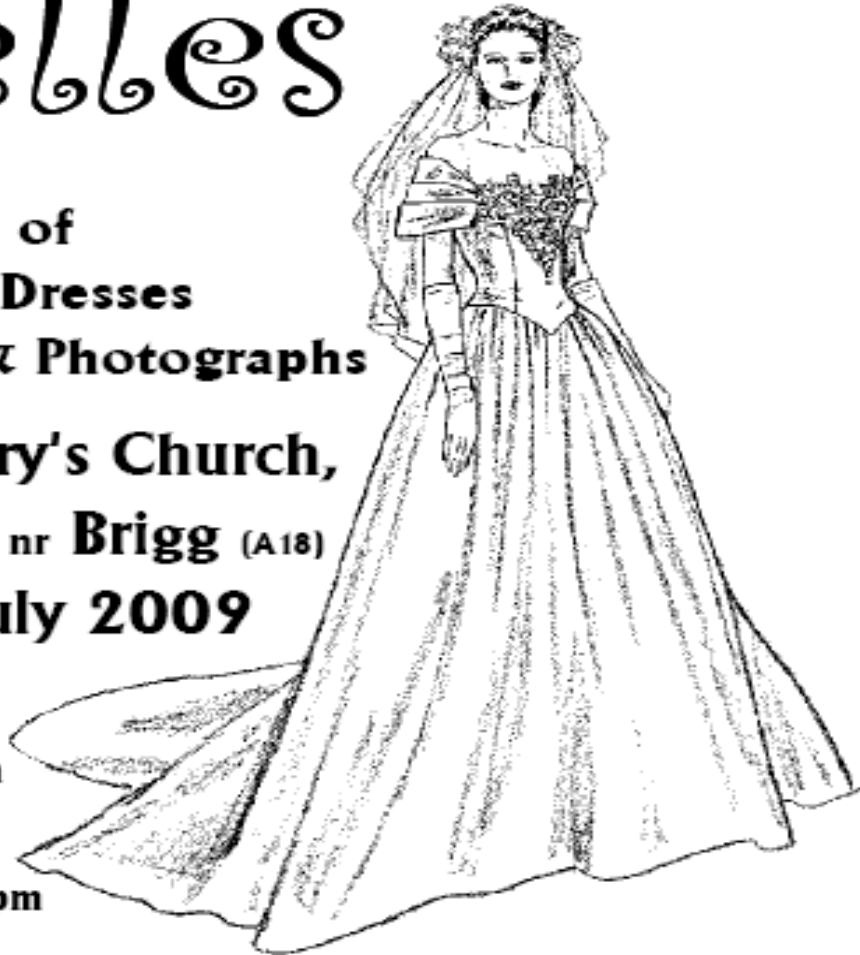

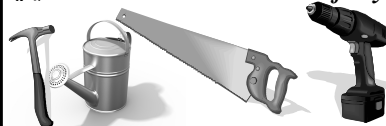

Why do these young lads think they invented these songs? I wanted to tell him that I was probably dancing around to that before his mum and dad were walking - but I didn't! And not for the first time recently, I found myself saying "I remember that the first time around".

We all know that history repeats itself - fashions come back around, old films are rewritten in a modern guise, and all the best songs reappear, only ever-so slightly remixed - enough for them to think its theirs, but not enough for us to be fooled. It's scary, isn't it?

There's been quite a lot of talk about "history repeating itself" recently. The credit crunch has sparked conversations about the great depression of the 1930's and the sharp rise in unemployment seems to be an echo of what the country went through a generation ago. That said, for people facing it all for the first time, it's as if it's never happened before - and it's scary. More than ever, we need to stand together. To remix a well known saying - ask not what your neighbour can do for you, but rather ask what you can do for your neighbour.

There are people who work to make our villages and towns a better place for us to live in. We need to ask ourselves how we can work to this end too. I read in a book recently "the best way to cheer yourself up if you're feeling down, is to do something to make someone else smile". Think about it for a minute, don't you think its good advice? Times may be bad, but hasn't this nation seen worse, and survived? I am convinced that a good reason we survive bad times is because we look back to the examples our elders set us when they went through bad times themselves. What worked for them and helped them through, their community spirit and determination, will work for us too. And, hopefully *our* example will help today's young people, when they hit trying times. A bit like they reinvent our fashions and music.

Excuse me now while I go and polish up my rendition of Petula Clark's "Down Town" to sing to my year 9!!
