The school will be welcoming three new members of staff in September, details of whom will follow in the September edition.

Year 6 attended the Lincoln diocese Church Schools' Festival on 5th June, where they joined approximately 400 other children from other church schools in the diocese and took part in practical and spiritual events throughout the day. Meanwhile the Key Stage 1 children enjoyed a trip to the seaside, at Cleethorpes, complete with train ride, sea, sand and even a bit of sun!

The weather was also kind for Sports Day on 17th June, when the whole school was involved in traditional and not-so traditional races including sprints, sack-races, bean-bag races, relays and slowest bicycle race.



The children are looking forward to a whole-school trip to a 'horrible histories' performance at the Baths Hall in Scunthorpe and then the end of year Leavers' Service in the church on 22nd July before the school closes for the summer holidays on 23rd July.

POLICE NEWS

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Information from Wrawby Parish Council Meeting 4th June 2013

1. Councillors were once again delighted to hear that the previous request for litter picking volunteers had drawn such a healthy response. As previously mentioned, the Parish Council is happy to support this initiative by covering the cost of equipment being purchased and is grateful for the assistance being provided by North Lincolnshire Council.

2. The replacement of plants in the beds around the village is to take place shortly and by the time residents read this, hopefully this will have been completed.

3. Council has been looking into the provision of Wi-Fi in the Village Hall (there was originally a land-line telephone) but the installation costs, together with the monthly fees, are not considered cost effective and Council is at this time unwilling to commit public money to this. Should anyone have any comments on this, please contact the Vice-Chairman of the Council, Patrick Keilthy, on 655360 or e-mail <u>PKeilthy@Talk21.com</u> 4. The Play Area equipment (swings etc.) has recently been upgraded by Wrawby Playing Fields Association and the Parish Council has submitted a Community Grant application to North Lincolnshire Council for assistance towards the substantial cost of this and the necessary re-surfacing of the area. If this application is approved, then work will commence as soon as practicable.

5. Village Hall – the upgrading of the Hall facilities continues apace with a total overhaul of the lighting having been recently completed together with the purchase of a new cooker. Graham Foster - Parish Clerk

Questions, questions.

As I write, the pupils at school are about to sit the final exam of this exam season. Years of schooling going into answer questions in order to show that they have grasped what we have tried to help them learn. A stressful time for pupils, teachers and parents alike. Hours of studying, writing essays, learning formulas and equations, reading and re-reading, and hoping that the questions that come up will be ones that can be answered.

A few weeks ago, at a Local Preachers' meeting, we were handed out a sheet of questions. These questions were written by John Wesley, and given to members of his fellowship over 200 years ago. There were 21 questions on our sheet, and the first one was

"Am I consciously or unconsciously creating the impression that I am better than I really am? In other words am I a hypocrite? "

On first reading, I felt ok with this question, but the sheet has been sitting on my workspace for the past week or so, and I have to say I am becoming more and more uncomfortable with it. Sadly, I have to tell you that I'm also becoming very uncomfortable with nearly all of the remaining 20 questions!!

These questions may have be written over 200 years ago, but they are still a challenge to me today. Question number 10 is

"Do I pray about the money I spend?" I'm not keen on this question.

Question 15 asks "Am I jealous, impure, critical, irritable, touchy or distrustful?" Well ,I didn't think I was especially touchy until I started reading these questions!

John Wesley was certainly challenging those early Methodists to live the best possible life that they could, and those challenges are as real and valid today as they were then.

I keep looking back through the questions and recognising how much I fail on a daily basis, but there is real comfort in question 21..

"Is Christ real to me?" At last, a question I can answer. Yes!

For the pupils at school, they will get the best grades by giving the best answers to the questions they are asked. What a relief to know that, although God would really like me to live the best possible life I can, the only question I need to be able to answer in the end is question 21: Is Christ real to me? Yes, He is. And hopefully, this means that although my answers to other 20 questions are far from perfect, they are better than they would have otherwise been.
