
Our next Open Day is on Sunday  $27^{\text{th}}$  June from 2-5 pm, so please do come & try the seat out for yourselves!



Wrawby remains to be an area of low crime. However can I just take this opportunity to make the community aware of a couple of incidents that have occurred over the last few weeks. There has been damage caused to a window of a residential property in the village and also there has been a theft of a hanging basket. Both of these incidents are very out of place for Wrawby which usually suffers very little criminal damage etc. Can I encourage residents to remain vigilant and should they see anything suspicious or are experiencing problems with persons congregating in the area to report it to the Neighbourhood team. We are aware that various vehicles are gathering on the hard standing area in front of the village hall and are monitoring this area during our patrols.

Lead thefts are also on the increase again with various residential properties in surrounding areas suffering theft of lead flashing. As I write this I believe that Wrawby Church has suffered another theft of lead from its roof. Please keep a look out for thieves operating near public buildings. They will often look like legitimate workmen using pick-up trucks and wearing fluorescent jackets, however will have no equipment to re-roof buildings. A climber will cut the lead off the roof and drop it to the ground and the truck will collect it off the ground. Should you see anything that you believe to be suspicious please call the police straight away. Any vehicle registration numbers that can be obtained will be of great assistance.

#### Dear Friends

Moving into the holiday period, we are told that we shall have a hot, dry one – good news for some people, bad news for others! How lovely that we have those comforting words of Psalm 121- 'The Lord is your shade at your right hand; the sun shall not smite you by day, nor the moon by night.' What Good News it is that the Lord is our Protector. And what Good News it is to know that the Lord promises 'a spring of living water welling up to eternal life,' refreshment for our dry and weary souls.

As I am writing this, I am preparing to go to Oberammergau in Germany, home of the Passion Play which takes place every ten years. The history of the world-famous Passion Play dates back to 1633, when the villagers promised that if God saved them from the ravages of the plague, they would honour him in this way. In 2010, more than 2000 villagers will present the five hour long performance telling the story of 'The Passion of Jesus of Nazareth' for the 41st time.

It makes me wonder how many of us would keep our promises to God for so long! I don't know about you, but I'm full of good intentions yet so often I forget, or hope that God will forget! (Or, even more honestly, I'm sometimes too lazy!).

However, the promises which God makes to us are eternal. He never forgets, and always keeps to his word. When Jesus said 'I will never turn away those who come to me' – he meant it then, and he means it now.

'Come to me, all of you who are weak and heavy laden – and I will give you rest'.

Come to him – he will protect you, he will never turn you away.

Next time I'll tell you all about Oberammergau – if we get there! The volcanic cloud has meant that a number of airports have been closed down!! If not, I'll tell you about what we did instead – which will be a surprise to all of us!!

May you enjoy a wonderful, refreshing Summer
