PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Notes from Wrawby Parish Council Meeting 3rd May 2011

(a) The police advised that in March 2011 there were 5 recorded crimes in Wrawby - 2 burglaries in dwellings (both forced entry via patio doors), 1 criminal damage, 1 theft and 1 neglect of children. There were 4 other minor matters reported to the police, Once again, residents are asked to remain vigilant, safety conscious etc and to report anything suspicious, however minor, to the police.

Wildlife crime continues to be a problem in the rural area of North Lincs, including Wrawby. Over recent weeks, various vehicles have been stopped and if offences have been committed, these have been dealt with accordingly. Some earlier cases have now gone through the court system resulting in magistrates issuing fines, driving bans and seizing vehicles and then having them crushed. Once again the police ask for the public's assistance on this matter and request as much information (vehicle registration no's etc), as possible. The police has supplied council with a copy of its April Newsletter in which the police describe their 2011/2 priorities and their full policing plans for 2011/15. (b) Council is at present preparing an 'emergency' plan for the village and is liaising with North Lincs Council on this. Full details will be advised shortly to residents but in the meantime anyone who wishes to obtain details or who can help in any way is asked to contact the Vice-chairman of Wrawby Parish Council - Patrick Keilthy on 655360.

(c) Speed Limits - North Lincs Council is at present carrying out a full review of speed limits on roads in its area and again, full details will be advised in due course.

All too often, our relationship with God can be like this. He's there, working in and through each of us. The signs of His wonderful presence can be obvious, if we just take a few moments to look – He's in our lives, in our relationships and in the world around us. But life is hectic, with many calls upon our time, and with many distractions. We find ourselves too busy to do anything about the sense of God's presence in us, too busy to respond to His still, small voice of calm which is gently calling us to Himself. If we try, we can ignore Him and do all that we feel we need to do.

But perhaps even worse, when we do feel the need to pray, to ask for God's help, guidance or support for ourselves or our loved ones, sometimes we find ourselves too busy to hear how he answers us. He may respond, once again, with that still small voice, which we do not notice, or it may be through a person whom He sends into our live, but who goes unnoticed. All because we are doing all that we can to get through all the demands on our time – work, the housework, family time, visiting friends and so forth.

The weather's fantastic at the moment – perhaps we should all take some time out from the hustle and bustle of daily life, find somewhere peaceful and quiet. I personally like to 'escape' to the car park at the village hall and look out over the fields and in the direction of the motorway. When I take more time to be with God, in stillness and peace, I find my life transformed – life becomes like the view from the car park - a thin vein of activity (the motorway) surrounded by God's peace, beauty and love (the fantastic view). I find myself no longer trying to squeeze God into my busy schedule, but rather that God is there helping me through the commotion and walking alongside me. And in that peace, I am able to listen to, rather than avoid, what God has to say to me.

Ignoring things doesn't make them go away, so I better go and wash my hands.
