As many residents will be aware, Wrawby faces a constant battle against litter, particularly along the ditches of Barton Road, Brigg Road and Kettleby Lane and around the playing fields. Sean has organised the litter pick to be held on 15th June and invites anyone who is able to help to meet in the Church car park at 10am.

The Parish Council adds that it is delighted with the work that Sean has already done so far around the village and also by the number of residents who have volunteered to help him. There is a marked difference in the volume of litter on the main road through Wrawby. North Lincolnshire Council has promised to supply litter grabber tools and sacks and the Parish Council have purchased 10 hivisibility jackets. It is great to know that we have such public spirited residents in Wrawby and the work should stand us in good stead for the best kept village competition this summer. More volunteers are of course very welcome.

Following the tragic death of Wrawby resident Jack Barratt, 21, in February, his girlfriend Laura Hopton has undertaken a fundraising mission to raise £2,100.00 for the Lincolnshire and Nottinghamshire Air Ambulance Charitable Trust. Laura is aiming to raise £100 for each year of Jack's life and is currently in training for the York Race for All 10k. Later in the year, she will be heading to Scotland to climb Ben Nevis. Laura has chosen to support the Air Ambulance because many people are unaware that it is run entirely on charitable donations and sadly, it has been called out to several incidents in the village in recent times.

When Jesus taught his disciples to pray, he told them to pray to "Our Father who art in heaven....". He was trying to teach them that the God whom they worshipped was a God who cared about them and knew them. He was making them aware that they could come to God in a similar way to coming to their natural father for help. That they could see God as not some distant deity but an active part of their life.

Traditionally, fathers act in a protective, supportive and responsible way towards their children. Involved fathers offer developmentally specific provisions to their sons and daughters throughout the life cycle and are impacted themselves by doing so. Active father figures may play a role in reducing behaviour and psychological problems in young men and women.

In the first years of the 21st century, there has been a growing awareness about the importance of healthy father-child relationships. "Among these benefits are higher levels of school performance and increases in healthy behaviours... For example, children raised with significant positive father involvement display greater empathy, higher self-esteem, increased curiosity, higher verbal skills, and higher scores of cognitive competence." (Quote from Why father care is as essential as mother care for your child). In 2009, the Ministry of Community Development, Youth and Sports in Singapore commissioned a survey on the perception of fatherhood. It polled 2,220 Singaporeans and permanent residents aged 18 and above. The findings: **Fathers can be more involved in children's lives.**

99% think that both parents should be involved in their children's upbringing.

97% think fathers have an important parenting role

83% agree that fathers are involved in their children's lives

77% think fathers are as good as mothers in caring for children.

Fathers still seen primarily as breadwinners What do you think are a father's roles and responsibilities? Respondents were asked to give up to three answers.

Top five answers:

Be a breadwinner (46%)

Be loving and provide emotional support towards children and family (36%)

Help children with learning and school (18%)

Be a role model for children (18%)

Provide moral or spiritual guidance (17%)

For each of us our fathers will provoke different reactions from us depending upon the closeness of our relationship to him; he could be seen as loving and caring, authoritarian and frightening, friend, someone with whom you could go for help and advice, always there when you need them, or even distant and unapproachable.

It can be a difficult role to play and perhaps fatherhood or the perceptions of the role that fathers have to play has changed over the years. June 16th gives us an opportunity to share our thoughts with our fathers as it is Father's Day.




