If you would like either of these items, please call 01652 652084.

Have you got your valuable items logged? There is now a free database available which means that you can be re-united with your belongings if they are ever lost or stolen. Just register your belongings with IMMOBILISE, the free U.K. national property database, (Google it) which makes it easier for the police to reunite you with your camera, mobile, bike, laptop etc, should they be stolen. Simply inform the police and then go to www.humberside.police.uk/immobilise to update your items status, so that your item can be traced back to you. The police also regularly check second hand

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS from May Meeting

Roadworks

As residents have been advised before, Council was again informed that roadworks in the area are scheduled for the next few weeks. The Railway Bridge at Melton Ross is being strengthened and this will necessitate the A18 being totally closed for many weeks. Residents will be advised when the works are completed.

The previously advised installation work for the roundabout on the A18 near Ashby Ville Scunthorpe (Tata) commenced in May. Delays at both sites are likely to be heavy.

The refurbishment of Brigg Leisure Centre is proceeding on schedule and residents will be advised when work is completed.

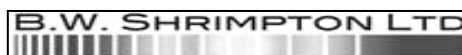

MARIAN TOYNE

Later this month the Bishop of Lincoln will ordain as Deacon *Mrs Marian Toyne*, a well known Wrawby resident. The Petertide Ordinations are to be held in Lincoln Cathedral on 28 & 29 June. Fifteen priests will be ordained on the Saturday evening, and nineteen deacons on the Sunday morning.

Marian already has a B.A. degree in Theology from Exeter University. For the past three years she has been training for the priesthood at Lincoln School of Theology, and is due to take an additional Honours degree this summer at Lincoln University. Congratulations to Marian on all her hard work in completing extra studies and practical placements alongside her regular work load!

After ordination Marian will be licensed as a 'minister in secular employment'. She will continue in her present post as Head of Humanities at the Outwood Academy Brumby in Scunthorpe, and also be a part-time unpaid Curate at St Lawrence's, Frodingham under the Area Dean (Canon Moira Astin).

As Marian faces this new challenge, please remember her in your prayers, together with her husband Dee and their sons Thomas and Joshua.

DOUBTING THOMAS

I've always had a problem with Thomas. He was the one who suggested that they should all go with Jesus to Jerusalem and die with him and yet he was also the one who wouldn't believe the others when they told him that they had seen Jesus, complete with his wounds, after he had died..

'Unless I put my finger into the wounds in his hands and my hand into his side I'll not believe,' he said.

Perhaps he's a bit like me. I often want proof. When someone I trust implicitly tells me a favourite television programme has ended, I still like to see for myself. Or if that same person tells me it's quicker to go to the supermarket by another route, I have to test it. I don't believe straight away and have to check it out. If Thomas is called 'doubting', then so am I and so are so many of us who like to be independent.

What happened when Thomas got the proof? John doesn't say that he actually touched Jesus' wounds but on seeing Jesus and hearing him speak he fell to his knees saying. 'My Lord and my God!' If he hadn't believed before, he certainly believed then.

Could Thomas have been portraying the rest of us? Those that came after Jesus had died, those of us who hadn't even been born then? He wanted proof, he got it. Not only for himself but for all of us who weren't around at that time. Those who came after, you and me. Was his test the exclamation mark to emphasise the fact that Jesus defeated death and promised the same for all of us?

And Jesus Statement, "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." Surely, that is meant for all of us. Thomas carried out the test, we don't need to see the wounds. Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe. That's you and me, providing we believe.
