North Lincolnshire Television now available in Wrawby

Do you live in a house that does not have internet access but does have digital television (such as Sky or Freeview)? If so, you can now take advantage of a new way to get in touch and use local services by using North Lincolnshire Television ('NLTV').

What is NLTV?

NLTV is a brand new digital television channel designed to provide residents with instant access to public services from the comfort of their home.

NLTV is available through digital interactive television packages such as Sky or Virgin Media, as well as through a mobile telephone, a computer or using a Nintendo Wii.

The service is active 24 hours a day, seven days a week and enables residents to access information and services. You can contact North Lincolnshire Council, North Lincolnshire Homes, Humberside Police and NHS North Lincolnshire directly.

Despite more than 80 public sector bodies from across the country currently using the service, NLTV is the first in which partner organisations have come together to provide one comprehensive and wide-reaching public service for residents.

How to access the service

Sky television customers can access the service by pressing the **Interactive button** on their remote control, selecting **TV Keys (option 9)** and entering '**NLTV (Key number 6588)**' into the box provided.

Virgin Media television subscribers can gain access by pressing the **Interactive button** on their remote control, selecting **News & Info**, then selecting **Looking Local** and entering '**NLTV (key number 6588)**' into the box provided.

NLTV is also accessible via any web enabled **mobile phone, computer, broadband accessible digital Freeview box** or through a **Nintendo Wii**, and entering the following address into the browser:
www.lookinglocal.gov.uk



The above services can now be accessed when you want them 24 hours a day, seven days a week from the comfort of your home. The service is free and available to residents who do not have internet access but have digital television facilities or web enabled mobile phones or Nintendo Wii (see left).

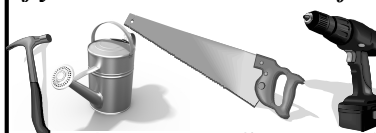

Village Hall News

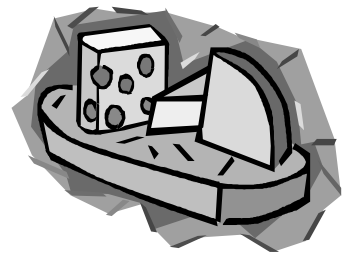
At a recent meeting of the village hall committee we received a cheque for over £800 raised through the village hall lunches prior to Christmas. The plan is that some of this will be spent on installing a double sink in the kitchen. The committee decided against having a dishwasher at present because of the expense of this item.

Various jobs have been done in the hall since our last meeting such as replacing the old heaters in the meeting room with ones that were taken out of the main hall when the new heating system was installed. There are also hooks on the back of most of the doors so that they can be fastened back when necessary to make access easier when carrying items into the hall. Curtains have been hung in the meeting room and a blind put up at the kitchen window. A wall-mounted changing station has been fitted in the disabled toilet, which the committee is sure will be a great help to the mums with young children who come to events at the hall.

As usual we will be serving a choice of homemade soup, bread, cheese and plum bread.

The EU, Defra and Yorkshire Forward have made £2.4 million available to be spent on local community projects in the rural areas of North and North East Lincolnshire over the next four years through the LEADER funding programme.

The Rural Local Action Group delivers the programme with support from North and North East Lincolnshire Councils. Not for profit groups are able to apply for funding to support projects that benefit local communities by reinvigorating villages, increasing basic services in rural communities or promoting culture and tourism.

LEADER has now awarded more than £600,000 to twenty-seven projects in Northern Lincolnshire, including a new village hall in Worlaby, adapting St Maurice Church, Horkstow, to make it more suitable for community use and the provision of a sustainable water supply at the Long Mare & Foal Allotments in Epworth.

If you feel that you have a project in Northern Lincolnshire that would benefit from LEADER funding, please contact a member of the team for further information. The decision panel, who select which projects will receive LEADER funding, meet regularly and they are now accepting applications for 2010 and 2011.

Police Report - December 2009

Wildlife Newsletter

The Clerk has received the latest newsletter from the Humber Wildlife Partnership which describes recent activities at local nature reserves (Far Ings, Waters Edge, Alkborough Flats etc.) The newsletter also gives a list of future events to be held at the reserves. Parish Council - Annual Parish meeting

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held in the Village Hall on Tuesday 2nd March. This is the meeting at which Wrawby parishioners can question any councillor, as well as the Ward North Lincolnshire Councillors present, on any matter. The Public Meeting starts at 7.30pm in the Village Hall and will be followed by the regular monthly meeting, which parishioners can also attend but only to observe the proceedings.

Planning Application - Kettleby Lane

A company called Green Frog Limited has made an application to North Lincolnshire Council to erect an embedded generating plant with associated works on the "old" YEDL substation compound on Kettleby Lane Wrawby. The application can be viewed on North Lincolnshire's website under "Planning" (www.northlincs.gov.uk/NorthLincs/Environment/planning/) and the following ref number PA/2010/0075. The Parish Council was still reviewing the application at the time of going to press.

Neighbourhood policing in Wrawby

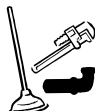

This month the church is entering the season it calls Lent; traditionally it was a time of fasting lasting 40 days before the great Christian festival of Easter. During early centuries the observance of the fast was rigid: only one meal a day was allowed and flesh meat and fish were forbidden, gradually the fast was relaxed over the centuries. However, many Christians still observe this season as a period when they will abstain from some foodstuffs or treats (eg chocolates!) until Easter comes.

Lent is still a time set aside for self examination, perhaps looking more deeply into one's beliefs, perhaps studying scriptures more closely using many of the specially written Lent courses. It could be described as a time of testing one's resolve; partly this is a reminder of Jesus' 40 days in the wilderness where he faced a period of testing and temptation by the devil.

Temptation is still all around us and we need constantly to be aware of the cost of falling into its snare. Jesus out in the desert quite naturally became hungry; the devil's first temptation to Jesus was that he should use his power to turn the nearby stones into bread. It might seem that it wouldn't really matter, it wouldn't hurt anyone and it would cure his hunger, but using that God-given power to satisfy his own desires would only have been the first step! How often are we in that position where we are tempted to use a position of power or authority to meet our own needs rather than for the greater good of others?

The second temptation Jesus faced was the devil urging him to throw himself down off the temple pinnacles:- "Go on, God will save you!" in effect putting God to an arbitrary test. There is sometimes a temptation to try and make a deal with God by saying I will do this if You will do that for me. God knows our needs anyway, so we cannot barter with him.

Test number three for Jesus came when the devil took him to a high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world. "Bow down and worship me and all these will be yours" said the devil. There is always a temptation to take something that isn't yours, or claim credit for work that others have done.

Jesus was able to withstand these temptations and I hope that we have his strength and help to withstand the many temptations which we face in our daily lives.

"Lord, grant your people grace to withstand the temptations of the world, the flesh and the devil and with pure hearts and minds to follow you."
