3rd February 2015 Brigg Traffic Lights

Council was informed that the new traffic light co-ordination system for Brigg was now in place and it is hoped that traffic flow would be improved as a result

Council was informed that the School Dinner Service is now to provide the Meals on Wheels Service. It is hoped that with the improvement in service, standards and food quality, the number of people using the service will increase.

Police Re-structuring

Council discussed the proposals to restructure the local Neighbourhood Police teams and how it involves Brigg Police Station. Council has been assured that Brigg Police Station will NOT close but that no uniformed operation staff will be based there. The Brigg and Wolds Ward will be covered from Barton Police Station from April onwards. The enquiry office at Brigg Police Station remains open for members of the public to attend as normal, but it is under review as to what will happen come April.

Although Brigg tennis club members normally store their rackets away from September to April, a number have been playing all year round. It started with the lovely autumn heat wave that encouraged members to continue well into October, only stopping when the light faded and the clocks were turned back an hour. Then some continued playing on Sundays, while a number of juniors had winter coaching at a Hibaldstow court by local tennis coach Adam Wrightham

The ladies team played in the Louth winter league which concluded with lunch – a variation of 'ladies who lunch' with a more energetic approach! Many more matches were won this year too. There was a 'Back to Tennis' ladies session held in Scunthorpe in November where some new, less experienced members attended, had coaching and supper.

Meanwhile some of us have attended the Brigg Recreation development meetings where we are trying to re-instate the four hard courts that use to be there along with an Astroturf pitch and good cricket wicket for our long standing town hockey and cricket clubs. These clubs have had to move away from their original home grounds due to the lack of facilities, but would like to return. The tennis facilities planned incorporate four hard courts, some mini/ junior courts, a practice wall and in the future, floodlights.

On a positive note a grant has been submitted for the club to develop more junior and youth coaching. It is waiting for Sport England approval. Information for these groups will be publicised shortly.

The club hopes to enter the local ladies league this year plus try out in the Gainsborough evening mixed league where juniors and less experienced players can gain match practice.

The senior club will re-commence at Sir John Nelthorpe School courts on Tuesday 31st March 6pm. FROM REV IAN H WALES - METHODIST MINISTER.

It's a great joy to be able to write these few lines for the latest edition of our magazine. I have to say a big thank you for the warmth of the welcome I have received in Wrawby. It has been good to get to know people at the Coffee Mornings, a soup lunch, a Harvest Lunch, a couple of visits to preach and on some pastoral visits too. I guess I had the advantage of knowing the area and lots of its people when I moved up from Bexhill. But I did settle quickly and someone said to me the other day 'You are not really the new minister anymore. It just feels as if you have always been here'. Thank you for that.

This magazine covers the season of Lent which begins in the wilderness and moves us through the ministry of Jesus on into Passiontide, to an Upper Room, a Garden, a trumped up trial and ultimately to a Cross. From there we move to the glory of Easter. Lent reminds me that Christ is with us in all of our struggles. A couple of weeks ago I was on our Methodist District Ministers Retreat at Launde Abbey where we were led by Tom Stuckey, who has published a book called 'The Wrath of God satisfied'. He took us through the various theories of the atonement and showed how they spoke to the situation of the day and reminded us that whatever our needs may be that God's love revealed in the Cross of Christ can speak to us. There's a line in a children's hymn we used to sing:

Sometimes I think about the Cross

And shut my eyes and try to see.

The cruel nails and crown of thorns,

And Jesus crucified for me.

Such is God the Father's love that if your situation or mine wherever we may be today was the only situation that needed Christ to come, then still God the Father would have sent him for us. And that's amazing!

Can I wish you a meaningful Lent and a joyful Easter when it dawns.
