## PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

#### Playing Field and Play Area

The Parish Council continues to support Wrawby Playing Fields Association in work to bring all the equipment etc. up to the required standard. New swings, steps, springs, gates and fencing have recently been installed and replacing worn out surfacing is now being given attention. Residents will appreciate however that all this work has cost a lot of money and effort - Paul Dalton on behalf of the Playing Fields Association has worked tirelessly in organising both fund raising and overseeing the purchase and installation of the new equipment. As stated above, the Parish Council has provided support and financial assistance. Replacing the surface is an extremely expensive operation - however Paul and the Parish Council are determined to see the whole project through to a successful conclusion and various sources of funding (including possible Grant Aid from N. Lincs Council) are being considered. Further advices will follow. **Road Works** 

(a) N. Lincs Council advise that work to repair pot holes etc. continues apace and currently 7 'teams' are employed on this work. Again, residents will appreciate that this is expensive and N Lincs Council continues to allocate substantial funds to this work.

(b) Wrawby Parish Council has received initial advice that it is hoped to install a new roundabout at the entrance to the Tata works at Ashby Ville Lakeside on the A18 road into Scunthorpe. The work will probably commence in the Autumn - full details will appear nearer the time.

# PRE-SCHOOL NEWS

DO YOU HAVE A CHILD BORN BETWEEN 1ST SEPTEMBER 2010 AND 31ST AUGUST 2011? If so, applications for registration are now being taken for children who are eligible to start at Wrawby Pre-school throughout the academic year commencing September 2013. (Children are welcome to attend from the age of two years and nine months.) Application packs can be collected during term-time from the pre-school building located in the school grounds between 9.15am and 3.15pm. Alternatively, you can contact the Pre-school on 07960021517. Parents/carers are requested to submit applications as soon as possible as the demand for places continues to be high.

The Pre-school is collecting Sainsbury's vouchers for Schools and the Nestle cereal tops. Donations from any villagers are gratefully received; last year's collections enabled the pre-school to purchase a substantial amount of sports equipment and books and it is hoped to be able to do the same again this year.

Any donations of SCRAP-PAPER would also be gratefully received as supplies are running very low.

## Make a Difference to a Child's Life

Do you have the time, skills and experience to meet the needs of vulnerable children and young people? If so, you might have what it takes to be a foster carer. Fostering is a big commitment. It involves offering a child space in your home, and in your life.

North Lincolnshire Council has launched a campaign to encourage people planning a career change in 2013 to consider becoming a foster carer. In recognition of the commitment involved, the council offers foster carers a comprehensive support package. This includes a maintenance allowance based on the age of the children and young people, regular social work visits and a variety of social events. The council also offers foster carers a tailored training package and support from therapeutic services, health and education. The fostering service welcomes enquiries from people aged 21 and over who have a spare room in their home. It particularly wants to hear from those who have experience of working with children and young people, or who have worked in other caring professions.

## Christian Aid—Faith in action

# 'So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead.' (James 2:17 NRSV)

Prayer is a powerful tool. However, prayer without action can sometimes be like eating a sandwich without the bread - it leaves you feeling dissatisfied.

In the book of James we are asked: 'If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill", and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that?' (James 2:15-16) This is a challenging question that should cause us to reflect. In the same way I would speak to a friend about a problem, reflect on our conversation, and then act according to what we discussed, similarly prayer should move us to action.

#### **Practical help**

This is one of the reasons why the work Christian Aid does is so important.

Christian Aid helps **in practical ways**, to root poverty out from the world. With other Christian Aid interns, I visited Zimbabwe to meet the communities that Christian Aid's partners are working with.

One of these partners, Dabane Trust, has helped local people start up nutrition gardens. These gardens are a bit like an allotment. Each member has a specific number of beds on which they can grow vegetables.

This method, although a simple one, has proved successful. We spoke to members of the gardens who told us that when they were separately tending their own gardens, they had no crop, and It can be easy to pray for those in poverty, and then leave it to someone else to help them out of it. Faith should be tangible, active.
