VILLAGE HALL AGM

The Village Hall committee held its AGM in April at the hall. The Officials were re-elected & two new members joined the committee. The Chairperson & Bookings Secretary is Susan Day, Treasurer is Graham Foster & the Secretary is Kirstin May. The other committee members are Bob Green, Mark Hebblewhite, Louise Tandon, Warwick May, Tom Smith, Bev Cross & Liz Hirst.

The hall has had a relatively good year with bookings for various events as well as the regular village groups who use the hall. The hall isavailable, at present, for regular/one off bookings on a Monday & Friday evening as well as some Wednesday's.

Due to an increase in the price of electricity the committee has decided to charge an extra £5 for hire of the main hall from Monday – Friday. Charges have not been increased for quite a few years. Other charges remain the same as before.

Our charges from 1st May are as follows:-

Monday – Friday Daytime: Meeting Room £20/session. Main Hall £30/session. Friday Evening – Sunday Evening: Meeting Room £20/session. Main Hall £35/session. Children's Parties cost £45. Other celebrations (40th, 50th etc., Anniversary party, Christening, Country & Western) cost £60.

Weddings - £150. 18th & 21st parties £150 + £50 cash deposit.

The charges are per session which can be either a whole morning, afternoon or evening.

Phone Scam

Packages (usually mobile phones) are being delivered to elderly people by legitimate delivery companies. If the person agrees to sign for the package there is either someone waiting nearby in a car who will ask for the package and say the delivery address must be wrong as they live close and were expecting one, or visit the property later to take the phone using the same story.

The phones have usually been purchased using stolen credit cards and a delivery address is reguired that can not be traced back to the offender. The phones are then sold on and that is how the offender makes their money.

If anyone you know does receive a package to their address that they have not ordered they should ask the delivery driver to take it back. If they have taken the package and can do so please try to get details of the person who collected the phone (car registration where possible) and contact the police on 101.



South Sudan—Anoon's New Home

Anoon Aleu, 36, grew up in the south of Sudan, but when, as a child, militia set fire to her house killing most of her family, she fled to Khartoum in the north. For a while life was good but an explosion of violence against southerners left Anoon and her husband Madut facing an agonising choice: stay in north Sudan and live in fear for their six children or give up relative prosperity for freedom in Anoon's former home, South Sudan.

Anoon did not expect life in the south—the scene of so much violence—to be easy. She explains: 'When we arrived it was just bush. We spent seven days living under a tree. We did not have any shelter. David (Anoon's son) kept asking me "Why are we doing this? What are we doing here?"'

The family huddled together for warmth in the open air but on the seventh night, depressed and wholly unused to life in the bush and the cold night-time temperatures, David died of pneumonia. He was just 17. "I will never forget the death of my son, " says Anoon. "It was so painful."

The family buried David under a tree. They were overcome with grief. David's father Madut tried to kill himself. His sister Eliza could not eat or speak and took to her bed. Anoon collapsed, seriously ill.

Hope Agency for Relief and Development (HARD) - one of Christian Aid's partners - heard about the family's desperate situation. HARD provided them with malaria nets, cooking pots and plastic sheeting to serve as a basic shelter.

Then came something that could benefit them for a lifetime—money to build a brick home, which Madut built himself. Christian Aid and their carefully selected partner helped change Anoon's life forever.
