Just £5 could give Loko a loan to start her own business buying and selling tea and coffee, freeing her from her desperate task and allowing her to spend more time caring for her family.

Two years ago, Adi was the poorest of the poor. Then Christian Aid provided a cow which gave her family nutritious milk. Adi churned butter and made money. It gave her a position in the community where her opinion is valued. Now her dreams have turned into plans and she has saved enough money to build a small shop.

SAFER NEIGHBOURHOOD and POLICE MATTERS

Prevention of Bike Crime Session - 1st May at Ancholme Leisure Centre, 4pm to 7pm.

Between December 2013 and February 2014 there were 125 recorded offences of bikes being stolen in North Lincolnshire. Between December 2014 and February 2015 this figure dropped to 115. However the value of thefts has risen by nearly by £6,000 to over £87,000.

At the sessions residents will be encouraged to register their valuables on the free Immobilise website to deter thieves, hinder criminal dealers and overall reduce theft.

Immobilise is a free national property database that stickers your belongings, home, car and bike. The website allows you to be reunited with belongings if they are ever lost or stolen.

Crime prevention products including Bike/Scooter alarms and locks, warning stickers, UV pens, and ground anchors will be given away available on a first come, first served basis. Those that receive free cycle security products will be asked to register them on the Immobilise website with the aim of the sessions to try reduce cycle theft and non-dwelling burglaries.

Help Prevent Sneak - in burglaries.

Please be aware we usually experience and increase in Sneak in thefts as the weather improves. Just a few seconds is all a sneak thief needs to open the back door, lift a wallet, purse or car keys and disappear again. Please help prevent sneak in burglaries by:

- Locking windows and doors when you come in or are outside
- Keeping keys and valuables out of sight and away from open doors and windows

If you feel intimidated by criminal action on a train, rather than picking up your mobile to ring for assistance and drawing attention to yourself a text message to 61016 may be a better and much more discreet option.
