

REMEMBRANCE

The month of November seems to be the month set aside for remembering. November 5th of course, sees the remembrance of a potential act of terrorism that would have changed the face of English history, and one of its chief instigators, Guy Fawkes. The fact that the plot failed is perhaps one of the reasons it is commemorated, it has become Bonfire Night. A night to celebrate and set the skies ablaze with fireworks.

For many, November is the time to remember more recent turbulent times, with Remembrance Day and the recollection of so many who sacrificed their lives for a free world. Words can never convey the debt we owe to them and indeed to those who continue to lay down their lives to ensure that we enjoy the freedoms that we do.

"At the going down of the sun and in the morning we will remember them".

As Christians we begin the month with two major acts of Remembrance, All Saints Day on November 1st and the following day All Souls. On these two days we especially recall and give thanks for those the church has recognised as supreme examples of godly living, sacrifice, and for the teaching they passed on to others. All Souls or to give it its fuller title, the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed, gives us the chance to publicly remember our loved ones who have died. We may hold them in our hearts and remember them always, but the church gives us an opportunity to honour them in a more formal way - how good it is sometimes to be able to open our hearts!

Some would say that the whole of our Faith is based on remembrance; not only do we recall the life and teaching of Jesus Christ, we remember His sacrifice on the cross for us and his resurrection from the dead promising us everlasting life in heaven. We follow his instructions to remember him in the breaking of bread as we celebrate Communion every Sunday echoing with his words :

"Do this in remembrance of me".

Why this need for remembrance? One possible answer is to do with 'community'; no matter how much we try to be individuals, human beings are very much social creatures. There is this need for interaction with one another to form what we call communities, a need to 'belong', part of which is to realise that the present does not take place in isolation; it has a part with the past and prepares for the future. The past reminds people not only what has gone before but that whatever we face has in one shape or other been faced before. Remembrance helps us then, hopefully to learn from the past and be prepared for the future.

As a recent mobile phone advert reminds : "We are who we are because of all these..." Nigel.
