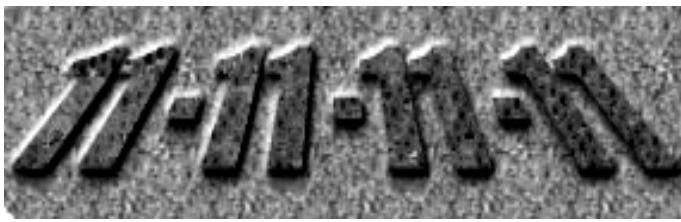


Church and November 2011 Community News

Many people associate Remembrance Day with heroes of D-Day or the Battle of Britain's Spitfire pilots. Some people think of the deeds of the SAS during the Falklands conflict or, of course, Flanders Fields from World War I, carpeted in poppies growing where so many men lost their lives.

But in the last few years it's also been about the nation showing its support for the soldiers returning injured and traumatised from current conflicts.

There will be an act of remembrance at St Mary's Church, Wrawby on the 13th November starting at 10.45 a.m.

Please come to pay respect to those who have given their lives in the various wars and conflicts that have taken place during this and the last century.

Stay Safe this Bonfire Night - Follow the Fireworks Code

- When buying fireworks, make sure they comply with BS 7114 and are clearly marked for their intended use "Indoor, Garden or Display"
- Keep fireworks in a sealed box or tin
- Use them one at a time, replacing the lid immediately
- **NEVER** put fireworks in your pocket
- Read the instructions carefully, using a torch or hand lamp **NEVER** use a naked flame
- Light fireworks at arms length using a taper or a firework lighter
- Stand well back and **NEVER** return to a firework after it has been lit, it could explode in your face
- Ensure that all children with fireworks are well supervised
- **NEVER** throw fireworks
- Keep all pets and animals indoors

Take care of sparklers, wear gloves to hold them and dispose of sparklers in a bucket of water as soon as they are finished

Recorded crimes in Wrawby during September 2011



- 2 x Criminal damage to property (single incident – one suspect)
- 1 x Burglary in a dwelling
- 1 x Theft (from St Mary's Church)
- 1 x Possessing a controlled drug
- 1 x Having a bladed weapon in a public place

These last two offences relate to a single incident. A man has been arrested and charged.

Eight other matters have included children playing dangerous games on Barton Road, information being given about bogus traders, and four traffic related matters.



Beware: That unexpected email may be a scam

Reports regularly come to the Brigg and District Neighbourhood Police Teams from people who suspect that they have been victims of scam emails.

The aim of these emails is usually to steal your personal or business details so that they can take money from your bank account, or otherwise cheat you into parting with money without your knowledge or against your better judgement.

The National Fraud Authority estimates that last year individuals in the UK were defrauded of a staggering £4 billion.

Don't allow yourself to be a victim

Almost any unexpected email could be a scam – even when you think you know who sent it. Typically the email will show at least some of these features:

the sender's email address doesn't tally with the website address of the organisation that it claims

- to represent the email does not use your proper name, but uses a non-specific greeting like "dear customer"
- the email conveys a sense of urgency; for example the threat that unless you act immediately your account may be closed
- the email displays a prominent website link. These can be forged or seem very similar to the proper address, but even a single character's difference means a different website
- the email includes a request for personal information such as user name, password or bank details
- the email contains spelling and grammatical errors

If you suspect you have just received a scam email:

Do not click on any links in the scam email.

Do not reply to the email or contact the senders in any way.

If you have clicked on a link in the email, do not supply any information on the website that may open.

Do not open any attachments that arrive with the email.

Forward the email to email@actionfraud.org.uk.

NB: When you send an email you are doing so over the open internet, where security cannot be guaranteed. Therefore please do not send personal information, such as your address or bank account details, when emailing Action Fraud.

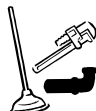

Thought for November

From the moment of conception, to the point of death, all humanity has the capacity for growth.

Many Christian people have a Rule of Life. A simple set of rules they keep in order to help them to grow in themselves and in their relationship with God and their neighbours – just half a dozen or so simple things to focus them on their faith journey.

I must confess that I am very bad at keeping my own Rule of Life. I admitted this fact to a priest recently, and his response surprised me. There I was, feeling guilty and beating my self up about my failure to keep my Rule. His response was so simple, and gentle, yet at the same time it challenged me. The priest asked me if my Rule was realistic.

Given that I set my Rule of Life almost 10 years ago, I hadn't considered how much my life has changed since then. Neither had I accounted for this within my Rule. I was Curate of five parishes in E. Yorkshire, and am now I'm Vicar of five parishes here, the work load is both very different, and much more time consuming. I was single, and now am married. I worked under a priest, being trained, and now (until last month) I have been responsible for training a priest. My life situation then was very different to how it is now.

So I've prayed and reflected over the past few days, and revised my Rule of Life. It now reflects the situation and circumstance I find myself in today. It hasn't changed greatly, but it is more realistic and the goals are attainable. It still challenges me, but the challenges are realistic.

Life can change dramatically, yet all too often these changes are so gradual that we don't always notice them. We ourselves also change, again, often unnoticed to ourselves. It is important that we do not persecute ourselves for what we haven't achieved, particularly if our lives have changed so much that our goals and personal expectations have become unrealistic. The best course of action in such a case is to revisit these and ensure that they are challenges we can meet, resisting the temptation to give up on them altogether. For it is these goals that shape and form us into the people we are. And through them we continue to grow - life without growth isn't really living.
