### **Police Matters**

The Police have advised that there were 3 recorded crimes in Wrawby in August 2012 - 1 x theft in a dwelling (a horse's harness), 1 x assault (domestic incident) and 1 x criminal damage endangering life ( stones being thrown from a motorway bridge). Once again residents are asked to remain vigilant and report anything suspicious (999 for emergencies, 101 for anything else, ask for Brigg Police Station or call Crimestoppers on 0800 555111).

Members of the local Police Team were warmly welcomed when attending the Wrawby Horticultural Show in August. 

# Neighbourhood Watch News. All parents please note!

A message has been received from the Neighbourhood Watch Development Officer following the attempted abduction of an 11 year old girl in Scunthorpe. The child was walking home from school when a vehicle pulled up alongside her and the driver leaned across the front passenger side and took hold of the victim near her elbow. Fortunately she hit out at the driver and ran away. Fortunately, she was uninjured. The message continues: "Incidents like this do not happen frequently and this was an isolated incident, but people need to be aware and parents need to remind their children about how to stay safe."

### Rogue Trader / Bogus Official Offences

An urgent reminder to be aware and vigilant in respect of a current spate of Rogue Trader / Bogus Official type offences being committed across North Lincs. by travellers. In the latest incident, an 80 year old lady was visited yesterday at her home off Scotter Road on the outskirts of Scunthorpe. She was told that her roof needed repairs and they offered to do the work for £7000, but then offered her a 'special deal' to do the work for £4500. The old lady was confused but the men took her to her bank to draw out the money. Relatives of the victim were informed by suspicious neighbours and attended, but the offenders made off with the money in a white Ford Transit reg. no. AP 04 UAA. The Police are investigating and believe the offenders are travellers from Nottinghamshire. Please be aware and look out for any elderly or vulnerable residents. It goes without saying that any suspicious persons/vehicles should be reported to the Police immediately.

### **High Speed Broadband Update**

Although BT have stated that they hope to have all the arrangements for residents to obtain their Infinity Broadband service by 31st December, it seems that many residents are able to obtain Infinity now!! Reports to the Parish Council and this magazine seem to confirm that most of the village is already "Infinity enabled". BT are unable to confirm that the whole village will be able obtain Infinity. There seems to be a question mark over addresses at the eastern end of the village. Thank you those residents who have kept us informed of their success and lack of it.

I was preparing a gentleman for his death during the summer, and he said to me, "You're not actually dead, as long as someone remembers you and holds your memory in their hearts."

In the Church's Year, November is something of an emotional month. We begin the month with All Saint's Day, when we call to mind all the saints of the Church. The following day is All Soul's Day, when we commemorate the Souls of the Faithful Departed. Soon after this, we keep Remembrance Sunday, commemorating those who have died during wars and conflicts throughout history. And among the many principal and lesser holy days of November, we keep the Feast of Christ the King as the month draws to a close. On this day, the Church celebrates the Kingship and reign of Jesus, Who lived on earth as a human, Who died and was resurrected, and Who has ascended to His Father's right hand in glory.

All of these services and commemorations take place at the end of the Church's year. The Sunday following Christ the King is The First Sunday of Advent, which marks the beginning of a New Year in the Christian Calendar. Advent is often misunderstood – it is not actually a time of preparation for Christmas, but is a period of anticipation as we spiritually prepare ourselves for the time when Jesus will come again.

So through November, as we remember all those whom we have known and loved in this life, and celebrate the Kingship of Christ, we also begin to look forward, reflecting on our own mortality in anticipation of Advent. We give consideration to the Last Four Things – death, judgement, heaven and hell. Yet neither looking back and calling to mind our loved ones departed this life, nor looking forward and reflecting upon our own mortality takes away the pain caused by the death of a loved one. And whilst, over time, we may learn to live with our loss, we may still hurt and deeply miss those whom we have lost.

Most of us, I guess, will carry loved ones on our hearts, yet hopefully their memory brings us strength, comfort and inspiration – as we journey through November, we do so in the hope that we, with our loved ones and with all the faithful departed, may enter into the fullness of life where we gather before the throne of glory in the life of the Kingdom to come.

May God grant you His comfort and His peace, His light and His joy, in this world and the next. With every blessing, Owain
