Humber Sports Partnership Courses

The Council has received a copy of the latest brochure for courses available locally within the next few months. HOME SECURITY MONTH OCTOBER 2014

Following the clocks going back on 26th October, the nights quickly turn darker and you need to ensure your property is secured. Most burglars are opportunists and will break into homes that are easy targets. Good security and basic precautions reduce the chance of your home being burgled.

Below is a checklist of the most common entry points used by criminals. By reviewing the security in and around your house, you can identify areas where additional burglar prevention may be required.

Are all the boundaries in good condition?	Y/N	Check for weak points or easy entry points	
Are the front boundaries no more than 1m and the rear no more than 1.8m?	Y/N	Low front boundaries give good visibility whilst high rear boundaries provide good security. Review new products on the market eg passive infrared sensor which will send you a text if your perimeter is breached.	
Do you have locked side gates at all access points? Are trees and shrubs well trimmed?	Y/N	Secure side entrances with lockable gates will minimize ease of entry. This helps prevent burglars being able to hide and be unobserved	
Is there outside security lighting, including covering the front of the property?	Y/N	Good lighting is essential for deterring burglars. Use low level dusk to dawn lighting which comes on during darkness. Motion activated lighting	
External doors - are they in good condition and strong enough to withstand a forced entry?	Y/N	Frames should be fitted and doors should be certified to the British Standard. Ensure locks have Euro profile cylinders to TS007 standard.	
Is a security chain or door spyhole fitted?	Y/N	Always use a chain and check the identity of unknown visitors. Review new market products such as a doorbell with digital door viewer.	
Are patio doors fitted with robust locks?	Y/N	Ensure an "anti-lifting" device with 5 locking points is fitted.	
If you go to work outside eg garden or garage, do you lock the house?	Y/N	Lock the door even when you are about. Over 33% of burglars use poor security as a means of entry.

HOME SECURITY MONTH OCTOBER 2014 continued.....

Are windows and frames in good repair?	Y/N	When replacing windows look for PAS24:2012 standard.
Are locks fitted to all accessible windows?	Y/N	Locks can be fitted to all window types. Ensure they are fitted correctly
If windows open more than 9" are window restrictors fitted?	Y/N	This is particularly important for ground floor windows. Over 33% of burglars use poor security as a means of entry.
Do you have a burglar alarm installed?	Y/N	Any installed alarm should meet British Standard BS4737 (professional) or British Standard 6707 (DIY).
Do you have contents insurance?	Y/N	It should be sufficient to cover the total contents value, any specific high value items and areas, such as tools in shed.
Is your valuable property marked and registered?	Y/N	Keep an inventory of all valuable items and permanently mark them eg with a UV pen. Also register items on www.immobilise.com
Security to shed	Y/N	Are door hinges attached with or non-return screws? Are anchorage points laid into concrete within the shed? Review new products available to the market eg closed shank padlock with alarm or passive infra-red sensor texting shed/garage alarm
Do you have contents insurance for your shed or garage?	Y/N	It should be specific for the total contents value and any specific high value items and areas.
Is valuable property in your shed and/or garage marked and registered?	Y/N	Keep an inventory of all valuable items and permanently mark them eg with a UV pen. Also register items on www.immobilise.com

WRAWBY ST MARY'S CE PRIMARY SCHOOL - SCHOOL TRAVEL PLAN

The School Governors are looking to revise the school travel plan. A School Travel Plan promotes sustainable modes of travel by encouraging walking, cycling, use of bus services and making more efficient use of the car if there is no alternative. The obvious byproducts of a reduction in traffic movements are a safer, healthier journey, regular exercise, flexibility, a reduction in pollution and at the same time encouraging independence and social responsibility.

Working closely with pupils, parents, staff, governors, residents, local councils etc., the school is looking to develop a plan representing all views and supported by the community.

In order to help develop the plan we are seeking the views of the local community, particularly of those residents living near the school. These views, along with those of pupils, staff and parents/guardians, will be incorporated into the new document. Once completed the document will be available via the school website.

Reflection

There have been many events this year marking 100 years since the beginning of the first world war, including our own amazing weekend here in Wrawby earlier in the summer. On 9th November millions of people across Britain will stop again to mark Remembrance Sunday recalling not only those who fought 100 years ago, but also those who fought 30 years later in the Second World War, and indeed later conflicts right up to the present day.

The sentiments shared by those who served and lost comrades, those who waited and lost family, those whose communities were changed, have remained the same over the many decades. Whether it be as a result of loss on the Somme, or on the Normandy beaches, or in the desert of Afghanistan or many conflicts in many other places. The feeling of loss, of gratitude, of pride at their bravery and sacrifice on our behalf remains the same.

Many ask where was God in all this? It is important to remember that when war broke out in 1914, every member of the British Armed Forces were given a Bible as an essential part of their equipment. Many are the testimonies of how reliant soldiers were on their bibles. For some it was literally a life saver in that it stopped bullets from hitting them (bullets being found lodged deep in the pages). Others found it linked them with their loved ones back home (they may have agreed to read the same texts). Some found an inner strength from the scriptures they read. There are many poignant stories from the battle of the Somme of bodies recovered from shell holes of men who died with a new testament clasped in their hand.

Even today, chaplains are important members of the armed forces, as is collective worship. Sometimes when the threat of death is all around you it is consoling to know that God is with you and that Jesus has conquered death and gone before you. God does not take sides, He is, however, passionately concerned for individuals, you and me, in whatever situation we find ourselves in. He made us. He loves us. He seeks our love in return. In peace or war God is with us. Nigel
