

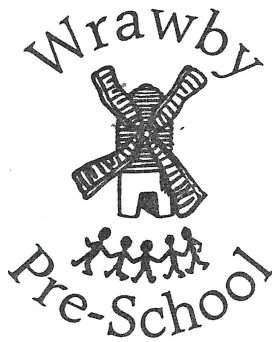

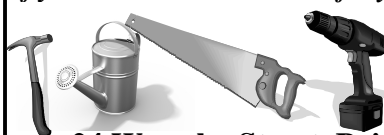

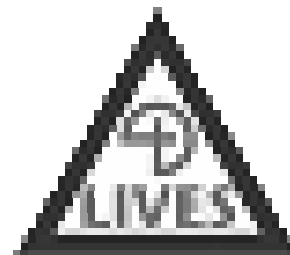

# School News

During September we have welcomed a very special visitor, a PE teacher from our link school, Yu Cai Primary, in Dalian China. The teachers are exchanging ideas about the teaching of PE and furthering their understanding of each others culture. The children have learnt some exciting new games from China and Peter has taught us some new exercises for 'Wake and Shake'. The children were also fascinated by an introduction to Kung Fu. The most difficult part for Peter has been learning to use a knife and fork, but he is determined to meet the challenge and is already better than we were with chop sticks.
