The 18th Camel

Remembering

Following on from the very successful First World War commemoration event in the village early in August and as part of the national commemoration of the centenary of WW1, a website "Every Man Remembered" has been set up by the Royal British Legion and Dan Snow. The aim, as its title suggests, is to try to ensure that every man and woman who lost their lives as a result of the conflict is remembered by the placing of a virtual poppy beside their name on the website.

Wrawby History Group members would like to play their part in this by placing a poppy against the name of all those remembered in their book "Wrawby at War 1914-1918". However we are very aware that there may be descendants of the families of these individuals who would like to pay their own tribute – or perhaps there are others known to you, who you would like to remember in this way.

We are excited to announce that we have been successful in fund raising a grand total of £28,418 for Wrawby Park!!

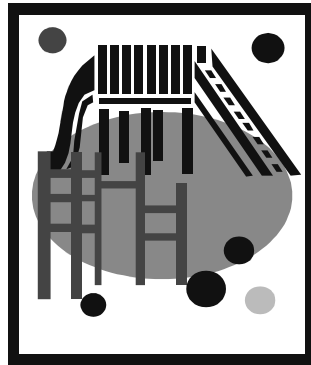

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS from September meeting

Vandalism

Once again, the Village Hall has suffered from vandalism, causing the Parish Council (and therefore the council tax payers of Wrawby) unnecessary expense. The external 'street light' sensor has once again been stolen (along with a protective cage) and also the Notice Board on the Village Hall wall has been damaged beyond repair and has had to be replaced. The street light is for the benefit of village hall users so when it is out of action it creates danger. The damaged Notice Board contributed to the village only achieving 3rd place in the Best Kept Village competition – if it had not been damaged the village may have won again (see below). Both items are extremely disappointing bearing in mind all the work put in by the council, and most of the residents, to uplift standards in the village.

Speed Limits

Confirming previous advices, residents will have noticed the revised 40mph limit from Brigg. N Lincs Council are to apply for a reduced 30mph limit to apply from the start of Barton Road properties at the Brigg end to the end of the houses before the railway crossing.

Best Kept Village Competition 2014

Council was gratified to hear that the village came a very close third in the 'Past Winners' category of the above, scoring 143 out of 150 points. The winner was Redbourne (145) and Scawby (144) was second. Please see above.

Car Parking Vicarage/Tunnel Road

Councillors have been advised that there is sometimes inconsiderate parking around the old shop/post office section of Vicarage/Tunnel Road, with blockages sometimes occurring. Whilst sympathetic to local residents needs, council is concerned that emergency vehicles require clear progress at all times. Council understands that there has already been one accident in this area and lorries/delivery vehicles sometimes cannot get through. Considerate and careful parking is therefore requested.

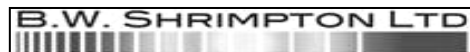

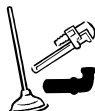

Will you set a place for Christian Aid this Harvest?

This year, our church will stand with communities like Alok, in South Sudan, that struggle to find enough to eat or a secure shelter for their families.

Sudan has been plagued by two brutal civil wars. Two million lives have been lost as a result of fighting, famine and disease. Millions more were forced to flee their communities to escape the violence.

Nyipock Majak (pictured) fled his home as a young teenager to start a new life in the north of Sudan. He was finally able to return home to South Sudan three years ago, when the region gained independence.

Nyipock is just one of more than 2 million southerners who have since gone back to live in South Sudan. Many of them arrived with few or no possessions and have depended on the kindness of local communities to help them get back on their feet.

In South Sudan, our partners are responding to the current humanitarian crisis in South Sudan (for more details visit christianaid.org.uk/harvest) and also helping communities to develop in the long term.

Our partner Hope Agency for Relief and Development (HARD) gave Nyipock a cash grant to build his own

house. He is grateful to HARD for the stability and security a safe home brings.



Nyipock, who prides himself on working hard, built his own clay oven. Now he rises at six every morning to bake 600 loaves a day for his community.

He dreams of opening his own restaurant one day, saying, *'With the profit, I would buy school uniforms for my children and pay for their school fees. If they got sick, I would be able to pay for their treatment.'*

'I do help others where I can and let them have bread. It's mainly elderly mothers and children, who have very little'

Nyipock has so little, yet gives so much. As we celebrate God's gifts to us this Harvest, let us support communities affected by poverty and conflict around the world. Acting together, we can turn our daily bread into a secure harvest for some of the world's poorest people.
