POLICE REPORT The July report described a series of thefts of garden ornaments in Wrawby. The police will monitor whilst on patrol and as always, wish to encourage anybody who sees anything suspicious to call them with as much detail as possible, including vehicle registrations.

Driving to work the other day, I came nose to nose with a giant yellow combine harvester, pulling to one side to allow it to pass, it was a forceful reminder of the importance of harvest in our lives.

September into October is the traditional time set aside to give thanks for Harvest, as the long, hard and often dusty days of gathering in the crops have finished and it is a time for taking stock of what has been achieved. In communities like Wrawby, not all that many years ago, many would have been involved personally in the process – the number of farms was greater as were the agricultural workers. Even those who worked in towns like Brigg were often heavily connected to agriculture.

Harvest Festival was an important event in both church and chapel calendars and major community occasions, harvest suppers were anticipated with great enthusiasm. As a boy, being a member of the chapel Sunday School and also in the church choir, I was able to participate in both and what memorable days they were.

Today we are less involved .With the advent of supermarkets, we can obtain food at all times of the year, in season or not. Harvest has little impact on our thought processes, and yet it remains immensely important to our existence. Next time you buy your shopping just have a look at the label for the country of origin and you will become suddenly aware how global the harvest has become. As our own farmers will testify, harvest is becoming increasingly more difficult, despite increased and more efficient mechanisation. Weather patterns are changing and the demand for food, in or out of season, ever increasing. For many people, especially in the third world, harvesting for our own needs is bringing them increasing poverty and deprivation as their countries export to us to fund their international debt.

We are all too familiar with the images of people in countries like Sudan suffering from the effects of drought and hunger as a result of the failure of their harvests. Many charities and churches are calling for a fairer distribution of wealth, a revision of the whole process of international debt and trade as part of a strategy to help support the people of these countries. The size of that combine harvester in the road is a symbol of how huge and international the whole process of harvesting for our daily needs has become. We need to recognise as we give thanks to God for all that we receive, that often it comes at a price; a price that others are having to pay on our behalf.
