

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

<u>Police</u> The Police report for June 2010 indicates that thankfully once again Wrawby experienced a low level of crime with only one theft and a small number of traffic or domestic related incidents being reported. Once again, residents are asked to remain vigilant and to report anything suspicious, however small. As mentioned previously, the police are concerned at the apparent increase in poaching/lamping in the area and a meeting of interested parties (farmers, landowners etc.) is to be held in September in an effort to address the problem. <u>Wildlife</u> The Clerk (Graham Foster 651250) has received the latest Newsletter from the South Humber Bank Wildlife and Heritage Partnership (SHWAP) giving details of events to be held at various locations in the area (Alkborough Flats, Far Ings Barton etc.) - if anyone requires details of any event please contact the Clerk.

Bus Service 68 - The Wolds Villager The Council has received an advice from the North Lincs Council Public Transport Team (David Hewitt) that after a review of the usage of the above service, it has been decided to put the service out to public tender in January 2011. North Lincs Council recognise that the service provides essential transport to medical facilities, shops etc. but the low number of passengers on some journeys is giving cause for concern. Further, the vehicle originally purchased to run this service (started in 2004) is now 6 years old and is unreliable. There are times when another bus needs to be hired. The government has made it clear that councils will have much less money to spend in the next few years - in view of this, North Lincs Council cannot afford to purchase another bus. The January 2011 tender proposal will call for either:

1. The existing timetable to continue Monday to Saturday (Saturday services are currently poorly used) or 2. A 'new' Monday to Friday service only.

North Lincs Council invite reaction to these proposals so any resident who wishes to comment should contact David Hewitt at the Public Transport Team on 01724 297460 or any Wrawby Parish Councillor (a list of the Councillors is on the Notice Board outside Wrawby Hall Care Home).

<u>Village Hall</u> Further to previous articles, Wrawby Parish Council formally gave the go ahead for the new lighting system for the Village Hall Car Park. Work will commence in the near future.

Brigg & District LIVES First Responders

Since its formation in 2004 Brigg & District LIVES First Responders have been mobilised to over 1000 calls and have attended everything from a stroke to a heart attack or even Road Traffic Collisions.

The LIVES First Responder schemes were formed in response to the high number of 'sudden'cardiac deaths that were occurring in work-places and in peoples' homes throughout Lincolnshire. As well and attending heart attack patients, LIVES Responders are trained and equipped to deal with a wide range of emergency calls.

When a 999 call is made to the East Midlands Ambulance Service control, a controller on the 'LIVES desk' will locate the nearest responder on call in the area and dispatch them at the same time as an Ambulance.

Wrawby has two responders based in the village and every night from 17:00- 08:00 including weekends who cover the Wrawby and Brigg area in addition to the other 13 responders we have in Barnetby, Elsham, Brigg, Scawby, Sturton And Hibaldstow. Brigg Lives are here for you!

Enclosed with this months Wrawby newsletter is an envelope for donations, any amount is greatly appreciated, We will be collecting these in week commencing 6th September between the hours of 18:00-21:00 if you do decide to donate please ensure that the person collecting is wearing LIVES clothing and a ID badge.


FROM THE REGISTERS

This month's article is proving quite difficult for me to write. Not just because I've been told that it would probably not be a good idea to write about Morning Prayer again for fear of being repetitive nor because the summer holidays mean that the boys are charging around the house pretending to be Buzz and Zurg. No, the reason this article is difficult to write (or at least type) is because my arm is in a sling after dislocating my shoulder again. This time, I dislocated it playing basketball on an annual children's activity holiday that I go on.

The holiday is for children from the Liverpool area who would otherwise be unlikely to get a holiday, usually for financial reasons. We take about fifty children, aged 9-14, to North Wales for five days and do things like kayaking, archery, abseiling, swimming and go-karting – unless you've got a dislocated shoulder, in which case you just watch. The group that organises the holiday is part of an international charity called the St Vincent de Paul Society, more commonly known as the SVP. The SVP is "dedicated to tackling poverty and disadvantage by providing direct practical assistance to anyone in need," and there are hundreds of different groups or conferences around the country each fulfilling these aims in different ways.

The SVP was founded in 1833 by a Catholic Parisian student called Frederick Ozanam, who was challenged one day by a fellow student, who was an atheist and a socialist, to say what the Catholic Church was doing for the poor in France. An embarrassed Ozanam knew in his heart that the Church was doing very little, so he and his friends began to meet each week to plan visits and help local people in need. The society they formed took as their patron St Vincent de Paul, a 17th Century priest who spent a lot of his life working with the forgotten and marginalised poor of France. One of the first things Ozanam did was to take firewood to an elderly neighbour to prevent him freezing to death, but he soon realised that his neighbour valued his company more than the firewood. Thus began the SVP principle of direct, one-to-one interaction with people in need.

Our Sunday gospel readings this year are taken from Luke's gospel, which particularly highlights Jesus' love for the poor, the outcast, the marginalised, the outsiders, the suffering and the sinners. He demonstrated this love not only through his teaching but also by interacting, one-to-one with them. Jesus' 'good news' isn't just good news about forgiveness of sins and everlasting life but it's also good news that in his kingdom all are equally valued and loved. And that kingdom can be found here and now because Jesus is alive and we all have direct access to him.

There are so many different charities asking for money or giving us plastic bags to fill, there are so many needs locally, nationally and internationally that it can all seem overwhelming. It's right that we should think and pray about which charities we should support and how. But if it all seems too much we should remember the SVP principle, drawn from Jesus' own example, that there may be a person in need right next to you, and that direct, one-to-one interaction with them is sometimes worth more than all the firewood in France.

As we used to pray at the beginning of our school SVP meetings: "Lord Jesus, help us...to bring your love to the suffering or deprived. Help us to be generous with our time, our possessions and ourselves. Amen"
