


There will be a small charge for the meat & there will also be cold drinks, tea & coffee on sale.

LOOKING FOR MEDIEVAL WRAWBY

Wrawby Local History Group are embarking on a project to discover medieval Wrawby. Prior to the late nineteenth century the parish of Wrawby also included the greater part of the township of Glanford Brigg. Because of this we will be including Brigg as part of our investigations. We believe that the existing village of Wrawby is the site of an original settlement both before and after the Norman Conquest. There was also possibly a much smaller settlement at Brigg which was at that time a very marshy area, and certainly we know there was a medieval hospital there.

Our first planned activity in September (date/s still to be arranged) is to "beat the bounds", in other words walk round the original parish boundary as closely as it is possible. Subsequently we will be looking in more detail in land ownership, the church and the people, in particularly in the later medieval period from 1066 to 1485. We anticipate that to do this we will need to look more closely at documentary evidence of the history and landscape of the area, learn more about church architecture for the period, and possibly go on to do some "test pits" to see if we can find pottery or other artefacts to help us identify exactly where our medieval forbears were living.

Can you help us? You don't need to be a member of the group to make a contribution - nor do you need to be involved in *all* the activities we are planning. You can even be a passive contributor if you are willing to let us dig a test pit in your garden!

You are all welcome and if you think you would be interested in any of the activities we will be advertising in the coming months, please get in touch with us



Wrawby Neighbourhood Watch

A warning is being sent to people in North Lincolnshire to advise people against giving out personal information such as address, contact details and personal financial information over the telephone. On Monday 20 August police received a number of calls from people in North Lincolnshire who had been telephoned by somebody claiming to be an officer from Humberside Police. The person on the phone made a number of allegations in what appeared to be an attempt to obtain personal information from the person who answered the phone. The caller told the call taker that they had their home address details and they required their bank account information.

The calls which were made have raised a number of concerns, which are now being investigated by police. An officer has been to visit some of the people who were called to provide reassurance.

Often people who are targeted in this way are the elderly and vulnerable members of the community, however these calls can be made to anyone and they can happen at any time of the day or night. Humberside Police would like to reassure people that officers would NEVER call a member of the public, in an ad hoc way, to encourage them to report a crime or to advise somebody they have been a victim of crime. It should also be noted that Humberside Police also do not make calls to people and/or businesses in an attempt to sell some form of advertising.

If a member of the public or a local business is approached in this way, then they are advised to call police and not to hand over any confidential or personal information over the phone.

On occasions people may also be approached at their home addresses by people trying to sell things and/or to offer their services. Sometimes these can be legitimate, but also be aware that if it sounds too good to be true then it probably is.

If you have been a victim of any form of fraud then you are encouraged to call Action Fraud tel 0300 123 2040.

You can report any offences such as these to Humberside Police tel 101 or call Crimestoppers tel 0800 555 111. You can also visit the Humberside Police website for advice on crime prevention.

Back to Church Sunday

On 15th September at 11 a.m. the Methodist and Anglican congregations at St Mary's Church, Wrawby are hosting 'Back to Church Sunday'. This is an open invitation to all who live in the village to come to church that morning, whether they used to attend but no longer do so, or whether they have never attended but would like to give it a try. You will all be welcome.

If you did a survey to discover why people stopped coming to church, you would get many answers. I guess these would fall into two main groups.

Some just drifted away because their lives and responsibilities altered, perhaps they moved house, or someone was ill, or work was available, or the children started to go to football on a Sunday morning. Such factors can easily break the pattern. Could now be an opportunity to re-start coming?

Others made a decision not to come any more. Perhaps they were angry with God, or were experiencing doubts (which is very normal). Some may have left because of clashes of views and personalities, or feeling not supported at a difficult time. If this has occurred, we can only be sorry. We would like you to return, and try to work things through – a new beginning!

A special group are those who used to attend the Methodist Chapel, and felt a great sense of bereavement when it closed, and stopped attending worship. For them the church building can never be the same as the chapel, but Methodist services are as they were, with most of the same people attending. Those who stopped coming are still missed, and would be particularly warmly welcomed back.

For those who have never been to church but would like to give it a try, coming to a service may seem rather a big hurdle. If it would help you to feel more comfortable, you could choose to come to the Coffee Morning at church on Saturday, 7th September (10 a.m. to 12 noon) to get the feel of the building. Someone can show you around, and talk about what to expect on the 15th, which will be a very simple service of hymns, Bible readings, talks and prayers.

After the service we hope that you will stay to coffee so that we can meet you.
